A certified check or bank draft, payable to the Housing Authority of the City of Vancouver, U.S. Government bonds or a satisfactory, bid bond executed by the bidder and acceptable sureties in an amount equal to five percent of the bid shall be submitted, with each bid, or separate performance and payment bonds, each for 50 percent or more of the contract price, or a 20 percent cash escrow, or a 25 percent irrevocable letter of credit.

The Successful bidder will be required to furnish and pay for satisfactory performance and payment bond or bonds.

Attention is called to the provisions for equal employment opportunity and payment of not less than the minimum salary and wages as set forth in the specifications must be paid on this project.
