In Memory Of Andrew S. Smith (Smitty)

Andrew S. Smith (Smitty) was born in Richmond, Virginia on Nov. 24, 1926 and died in Bellevue, Washington on June 10, 1992.

He attended Providence Park Elementary School, Maggie L. Walker High School in Richmond but completed his G.E.D. in Portland, Oregon March 16, 1970 and attended Portland Community College in 1969 to 1970.

Smitty came to Portland, Oregon in the early 50's while in the U.S. Air Force, many of his friends remember him saying when he saw Portland he knew it was the city he would call home.

During the late 50's Smitty successfully ran the pool hall at the Casino Tavern. After his discharge from the Air Force he worked on the waterfront and was involved in the 25 year lawsuit, which opened jobs on the Portland waterfront to minorities. In 1969 to 1971, he was employed with the Oregon State Department of Employment as the Assistant Manager of the North Portland Placement Office. From 1971 to 1974, he served as a Planning Assistant for the Tri-County Community

Council, and was on loan from October 1972 to April 1973, as the Interim Director of the Model Cities Information and Referral services 4 C's Council. From August 1977 to August 1978, he served as a Job Developer with the Comprehensive Employment Training Act (CETA).

Smitty came to the Seattle/Bellevue area in 1978 at this time he was employed with the East King County Retired Senior Volunteer Program until he won his lawsuit against the PMA. At the time of his death he was employed on the Seattle waterfront as a Checker.

During the 60's and thru the 70's Smitty served on the boards of the Albina Citizens War on Poverty Committee, Albina Corporation, The Black Caucus and the Portland Greater Council of Churches. He served his country with distinction from 1942 to 1944 in the U.S. Navy, from 1950 to 1960 in the U.S. Air Force and received a Bronze Star. Smitty is survived by one daughter Nicole Andrenna Smith of Bellevue, Washington and many long time devoted friends. Services were held at Cox Mortuary in Portland, Oregon at 11:00 June, 19, 1992.
