

The "Heaven-Bound" Choir members, crutches and bandages, crippled and lame, broken and in wheel chairs, gathered at Maranatha Church for the last Earthly time to say good-bye to their dear sister Dornetta LaShay Dorn. The building was over-run with

well-wishers, family members, class mates, clergy, and church members.

This was the most beautiful and the most spiritual "going-home" service, as it was called. The songs and the comments, from those who had impacted her brief life, caused those listening to rejoice rather than mourn.

Seventeen days prior to her death, LaShay graduated from Benson High School. She had planned to take a trip to Florida to visit her sister, who is in the military, and to go to college in the fall; but, that shall never take place. "God, in His infinite wisdom, has chosen to pick the most beautiful of roses for His heavenly garden", a phrase exclaimed over and over again by all those who spoke.

There was certainly something different about this young lady's life because there were at least fifteen clergy assembled not just to gaze as if watching an interesting event; but, to recall what a wonderful person LaShay was and how they will all miss her presence. Rev. Raymon Edwards, pastor of True Vine Missionary Baptist Church, stated, "Life is like an airport with some people coming, some going, but none stay-

Rev. Merriweather recalled the comments from the choir members on the nineteenth of June: the day LaShay truly went home. "When LaShay got into the van, she went to sleep. She slept so soundly. At the time we saw the van getting in trouble, we tried and tried to wake LaShay up but she never woke up." Rev. Merriweather said, ".. For all we know, LaShay had already gone on home to glory when she got into that van."
