## Primo-Limo Wins League Ready For Playoffs!

On Monday, Joceylyn McIntire scored 20 points to lead Dr. Flowers over Stadium Sports Cards 60-52. Nicole Crawford, who hails from Oregon State, led the losing team with 13 points and 10 rebounds.

In the second game, former University of Oregon Star Vanessa Selden had 28 points in a close 71-67 victory over Tire Headquarters. Krista Smith led THI with 22 points.

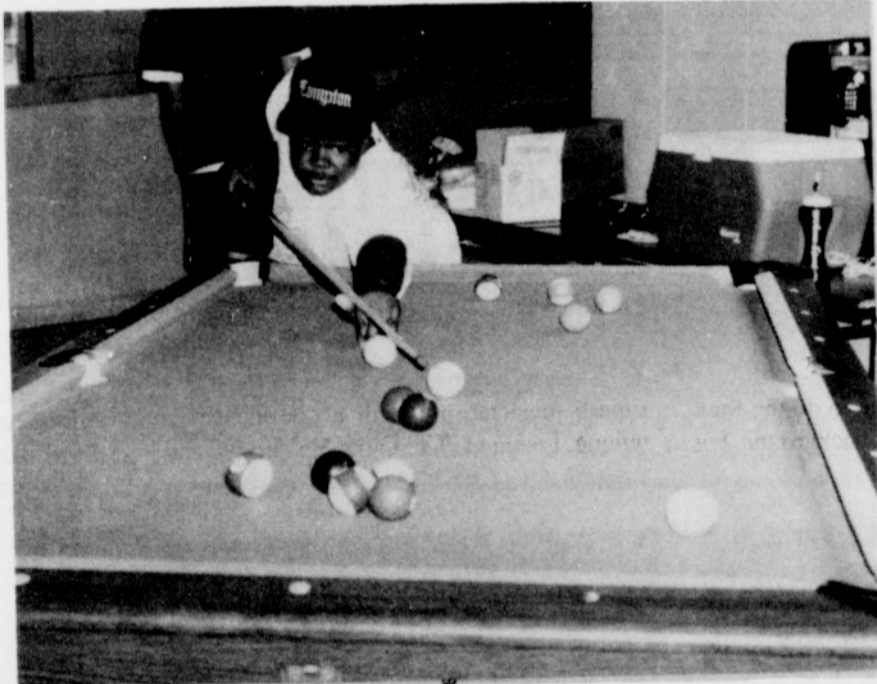

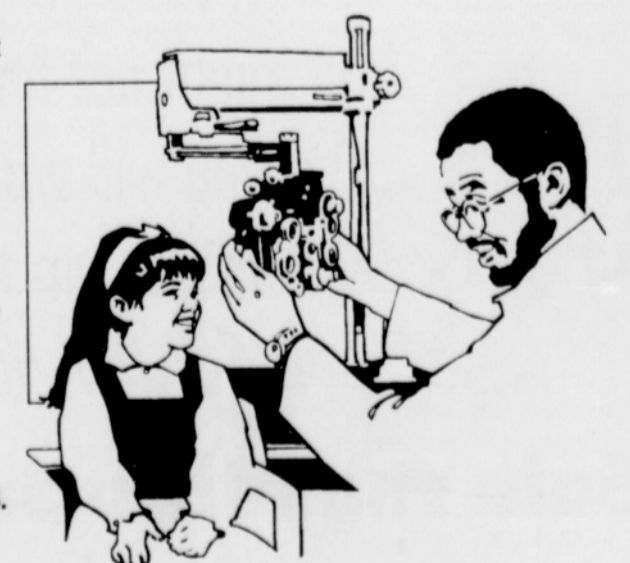
