ness owner with a background in social work and community activism.

"Gang Banging" -- It may not fit the traditional notion of a business enterprise but a close look reveals some surprising similarities. For example, a lot of successful people have developed their own business because they could not gain opportunities through regular employment. I'd say that's real true of "gang bangers." Surely everyone knows that one goes into business to fill an unmet need, to satisfy a market. Young people know that there is an unlimited market for violence and corruption seasoned by fear and frustration, particularly in Northeast Portland. There is a sense that they can have a field day because when they weight the other options, there is very little risk of failure, and success is virtually assured. Just ask the little young dudes riding around on bicycles selling crack co-

caine in broad daylight! The not-so-obvious benefits to our alienated youth is the recognition and a sense of respectthey obtain. Recognition is important to an otherwise invisible existence, labeled by many a lost generation. Negative attention is better than no attention at all. One wonders if a more sophisticated business could have gotten as much attention and publicity as these "gang bangers" are getting. This publicity has been a windfall for the "gang banging" business. As far as respect is concerned, young people have discovered that everybody instantly respects a .45 or a 357 magnum. And, since many young people can't seem to gain respect in traditional ways, to them, negative respect is certainly better than no respect. True, it may be a false sense of respect, but many see their stock rise with every TV news report, newspaper portrayal, or special youth program designed to contain their activities. The Mafia, Jesse James, Al Capone, Bonnie and Clyde combined

National Guard.

The most powerful comparison to business and gangs is the notion of ownership and belonging. Check out General Motors, IBM, Nike or some of the other big boys when they come under attack and their profit position is compromised. It may not be from the barrel of a gun, but you can bet there is guts if not blood involved. When it comes to the need to belong, hey, let's face it; it is a major, if not the most powerful, motivation in human behavior. That's largely what gang colors, "home boy", and the other gang symbolism is all about. Actually, it ain't too much different from the swoosh and

But more than anything else, it's about economics. As one former young "blood" members said on a TV interview, "We ain't stupid, it's about economics. If we had other options, we would take 'em." I guess to me that's why it's a sad irony to hear residents asking for the intervention of the National Guard. Instead of asking that the National Guard come into the community to quell the unrest, residents should be demanding that the National Guard make sure it hires and trains as many of these Black youth as it does a representative number of white youth. I have first hand knowledge that the National Guard is not a part of the solution, but in fact, is a part of the problem. The Air National Guard, in particular, is maintaining a virtually all-white, private flying club. The Guard is a large, farranging economic system in which Black youth, especially those with a poor education or criminal record, will never participate. Northeast residents should be sure that when they are attempting to drive out the demons, they don't risk getting the devil himself. The National Guard has relatively few people of color in their ranks, and many in the Guard are likely to come from

the community, packing M-16s, with little or no training in how to contain riots and civil disobedience, or conduct law enforcement operations. Some guardsmen have never seen a Black person alive and up close. It might be a bit hard for them to distinguish between a gang member and a teacher at the Black Education Center. Residents should be careful what they ask for; they just might get it.

As far as economics goes, the local police are not much better. It was about four years ago that I had breakfast with then Captain Potter at the Lloyd Center Red Lion Inn. The discussion was about how the police hiring process through the civil service system and police union politics almost totally excludes the recruitment and hiring of Blacks. We discussed a strategy to address the problem by establishing a pre-employment training academy made up primarily of Northeast residents. The police already have a reserve officer or deputy program that has for years been serving the same purpose, primarily for white residents. Well just the other day, I saw now Chief Potter coming out of the King Neighborhood Center. He had just finished a news conference outlining measures to stop the latest outbreak of gang violence in Northeast Portland. I asked him about our discussion of several years ago. He indicated that his office is trying to establish a citizen training academy, but it has been slow in coming. I'd say it's damn slow in coming, about five or six deaths too slow. I hope Northeast residents demand that he get on with making this happen with the same insistence that they are demanding the intervention of the National Guard. Because it won't be the armed forces or the National Guard that will put the "gang bangers" out of business. Rather, it will take the efforts of the National Guard and the rest of the community to include them and share the fruits of their business.

On Monday, September 14-the day before the New York primary-Congressman Ted Weiss died. Mr. Weiss, who had represented the predominantly white and Jewish 8th Congressional District on the West Side of Manhattan for 16 years, was one of the few liberals left in his party. It was common knowledge that Mr. Weiss, who had undergone major heart surgery twice in the last few years, was dying.

Within hours of his death, state Democratic Party leaders swung into action. New York election law allows party leaders-without consulting the voters-to appoint a replacement if the winner of the primary dies or is other wise unable to run in the general election (in a one-party town such as New York, whoever wins the Democratic Party primary is assured a victory in November). So party leaders needed to make sure that Congressman Weiss, though deceased, would win the Democratic primary.

This would not have been a serious problem except for the fact that the New Alliance Party, which I head up, had mounted a challenge to Mr. Weiss (who otherwise would have run unopposed) in the person of Arthur Block, a progressive Jewish attorney with impeccable credentials as a legal scholar, an educator, and a civil rights and democracy lawyer.

Suddenly all hell broke loose! There was a chance-remote, but the anti-democrats don't like to take any chancesurging voters in the 8th C.D. to pull the lever for Mr. Weiss despite the fact that he was dead in order to make sure that the candidate of the New Alliance Partywhich he said "opposes democratic ideals"-lost. David Dinkins, the city's first Black mayor, said they should vote for Ted Weiss and against the New Alliance Party, whose Policies he called "offensive." The Manhattan district leader, a Black state assemblyman from Harlem, chimed in on the same note. In response to reporters' questions, Mr. Block extended his condolences to Mr. Weiss' family, colleagues and friendsand that was that. He refused to participate in turning Ted Weiss' death into a political football.

On Primary Day voters woke up to editorials in every major newspaper obediently echoing the shamelessly antidemocratic scare tactics of the Democratic Party honchos.

I was appalled that these Democratic Party politicians and their friends in the press had turned the death of a human being into a platform for a political attack on the New Alliance Party. I was particularly offended by the comments made by Mayor Dinkins.

The mayor chose to attack the New Alliance party in the liberal Jewish community he routinely courts at the expense of the Black and Latino communities which delivered his victory in 1989. As his own re-election bid next year looms on the horizon, he is again seeking to ingratiate himself with Jewish electorate; trashing the Black-led NAP is one way to do it.

Now if Mr. Dinkins is so dead set against my "offensive policies," I challenge him to bring this anti-NAP attitude up to Harlem! I challenge him to level the same charges against Barbara Taylor, an African American educator and New Alliance Party leader running in Harlem's 70th Assembly District! I

dare him to run the same line on the Black youth in the Crown Heights seotion of Brooklyn-the same youth I prevented from rushing the cops last year in what would have been a bloodbath (justifiably angry, they had come out into the streets in the hundreds when a seven-year-old Black child was killed in a hit-and-run accident and the cops helped the driver and his passengers get away before the little boy was even treated)! Mayor Dinkins (who is more at home at the U.S. Open Tennis Championships than in the Black community) had to sneak in and out of the community with a police escort.

Instead of taking pot shots at Arthur Block, why didn't the mayor come into the Black community and take a shot at me? Because, like the state chairman of his party, David Dinkins is playing a vulgar and opportunistic political game. He's using NAP as a smokescreen to cover the criminal and immoral corruption of the Democratic Party. Just as he forced NAP's candidate for the U.S. Senate, the prominent Arab scholar, Dr. M.T. Mehdi, off his Christopher Columbus Quincentennial Commission under pressure from New York's Zionist mafia, he is using the occasion of Congressman Weiss' death to score some more points with Jewish voters. He won't come to Harlem to take me on because he doesn't think it will help him politically. He doesn't have the guts for that fight. The only balls he has are tennis balls.
