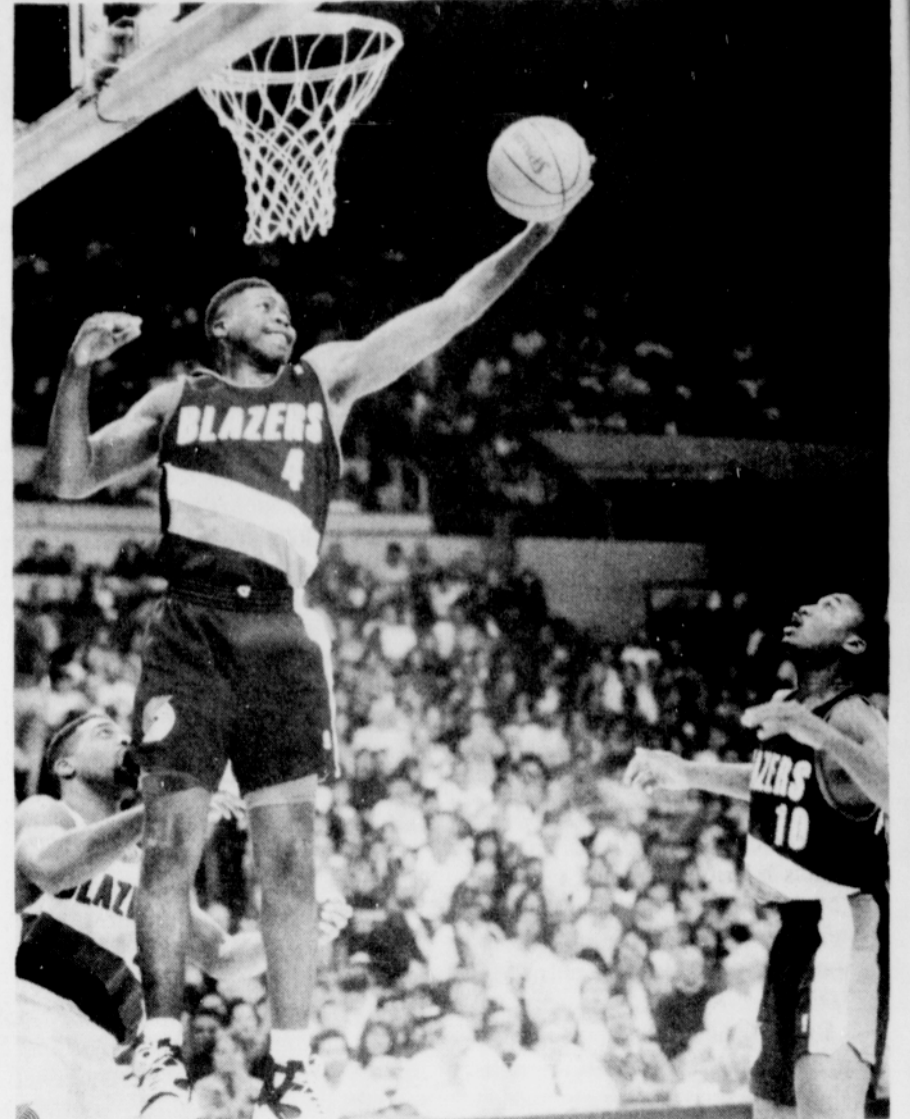

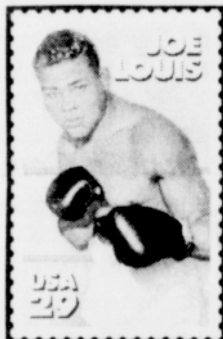

### Lewis & Clark College To Honor Edward Perkins, U.S. Ambassador To The United Nations, As Distinguished Alumnus



Edward J. Perkins, U.S. ambassador to the United Nations, will speak on "The United States as Global Citizen" at Lewis & Clark College's Anniversary Celebration Banquet, 7 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 10. The event honors Perkins as Lewis & Clark College's Distinguished Alumnus and celebrates the 30th anniversary of the College's hallmark overseas study program.

The Distinguished Alumnus Award annually recognizes an alumnus or alumna who has achieved distinction in his or her chosen field and has rendered outstanding service to country or community.

"Ambassador Perkins is a person of great vision, integrity and courage," said Michael Mooney, president of Lewis & Clark College. "He seeks ways to improve world trade, education and peace-keeping during a period of extraordinary change and promise. We

are pleased to recognize his accomplishments and to honor him as Distinguished Alumnus."

Perkins, a specialist on African affairs, was appointed as the nation's 20th ambassador to the United Nations last February. Previously, Perkins was the State Department's director-general from 1989 to 1992, ambassador to South Africa from 1986 to 1989 and ambassador to Liberia from 1985 to 86. He also served in Ghana and as director of West African affairs at the State Department. He speaks Japanese, French and Thai.

Perkins was born in Sterlington, La. He moved to Portland when he was a youngster and graduated from Jefferson High School. His mother, Tiny Holmes, still lives in Portland and describes her son as dedicated to books.

Perkins served in the U.S. Army and Marines, including a tour in the

Korean War. He attended Lewis & Clark College in 1953 and was its commencement speaker in 1988. He earned his bachelor's degree from the university of Maryland and master's and doctoral degrees in public administration from the University of southern California at Los Angeles.

While with the Army and Air Force Exchange Service, Perkins served as chief of personnel in Taipei, Taiwan, from 1958 to 1962. From 1962 to 1966, he was deputy chief and then chief of personnel and administration in Okinawa. He joined the Foreign Service in the 1970s.

Charles Hill, a top aide to former Secretary of State George Shultz, who is now at the Hoover Institute, described Perkins as a "magnificent individual" who could say much with few words, according to an article in The Oregonian.

"Perkins just says that's the way it will be," Hill said. "When he takes a position...you know he has great moral weight behind it."

"He made clear exactly where he stood," said Randall Robinson, whose group, TransAfrica, was involved in the U.S. anti-apartheid movement. "And he did things no U.S. ambassador (to South Africa) had ever done."

"Diplomacy is my profession," Perkins said. "I hope to convince every American citizen that, the broadest sense, in the competitive international, political, business and social environments of the future, diplomacy must be the profession of each citizen as well."

McCallister was picked for his outstanding play in the Demo's 22-8 victory over the Marshall Minutemen. All McCallister did was carry the ball three times for 81 yards -- on one he had a 59 yard touchdown run, on another he caught a 16 yard pass. However, this team player led Jefferson on both offense and defense. McCallister also has 650 all purpose yards so far this season -- 220 yards rushing, 178 yards recovering, and 252 yards of return.

The Democrat's football coach, Mark Pinder, says McCallister is a team leader and a big play man which they need in a player that goes both ways.

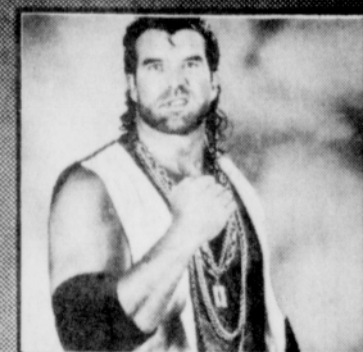
