## Seventy-Eighth Anniversary Banquet For The National Association For The Advancement Of Colored People

The Portland branch of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) invites the public to attend the seventy-eighth anniversary banquet on Friday, October 30th, 6:30 pm at the Holiday Inn Airport, 8439 NE Columbia Blvd. in Portland.

State Senator and candidate for State Treasurer, Jim Hill, is the special guest speaker for the banquet. Senator Hill is the only African-American running for statewide office in Oregon. Hill, an attorney served as a member of the Oregon House of Representatives from 1983-1987, and was elected to the Oregon

Senate in 1987.

The NAACP is the oldest civil rights organization in America founded in 1909 by a group of black and white citizens to remedy the historical wrongs of racial hatred and discrimination. Oregon's first branch office opened on September 19, 1914. This is the oldest branch office west of the Mississippi.

The 1992 theme is "Honoring our Past, Fulfilling our Present and Preparing for Our Future".

## Oregon Supreme Court Task Force Racial/Ethnic Issues In The Judicial System

The Oregon Supreme Court Task Force on Racial/Ethnic Issues in the Judicial System continues its series of public meetings being held throughout the state with a Portland hearing scheduled for Thursday, November 12, 1992 at Benson High School Auditorium, 546 NE 12th Avenue, Portland, Oregon. The Portland meeting times are 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. Interpreters will be provided at the meetings.

The public is invited and encouraged to tell the Task Force of their experiences with the Oregon court system and present suggestions about the treatment of minorities. Public meetings, accompanied by interviews and surveys, will give the Task Force an opportunity to accurately evaluate the current status of bias in the courts.

Judges made the decision to create a task force similar to those in Washington, Michigan, New Jersey, and New

York, following recommendations at the Oregon Judicial Conference in 1991. Chief Justice Wallace P. Carson, Jr. of the Oregon Supreme Court appointed the 17 member group to examine complaints about disparities in sentencing, security releases, interpreter adequacy and the charging process, among other issues.

The first hearing was held in Woodburn on July 28th. Public hearings followed in Pendleton and Ontario on September 28th and 29th. Hearings have also been scheduled for Klamath Falls and Warm Springs on October 26th and 27th. The final hearing will be held in Salem, with November 19th as the tentative date, pending selection of a meeting place.

A one-year completion date has been targeted for the final Task Force report. For additional information call 1-800-528-3974.

## Second Annual Youth Leadership Conference

## Whitney Young Education Center Offers Free SAT Review

The Urban League of Portland's Whitney M. Young, Jr. Education & Cultural Center is offering a series of free review sessions for the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT), the standard aptitude test taken by high school students interested in attending college. The sessions take place Thursdays from 4-6 p.m. at the Center, located at 10 North Russell Street.

The sessions are designed to help high school sophomores, juniors and seniors prepare for SAT exams offered in November, January and March. "Many students do poorly on their SAT exam simply because they are unfamiliar with the format," said Urban League Education & Career Development Director Herman L. Lessard, Jr. "In addition to reviewing reading, English and math skills, we will hold a mock exam to help students learn how to work within SAT time limits."

## Urban League Offers Free College Financial Aid Workshop

The Urban League of Portland and Funds for College, Etc. will offer a free workshop on obtaining college financial aid on Tuesday, October 27 at 6 p.m. at the Urban League, 10 North Russell St. The workshop is designed to help parents and students locate financial aid sources they may not have known about.

"Each year many college scholarships go unused because people did not know about them," Urban League Director of Education & Career Development Herman L. Lessard, Jr. said. "Funds for College, Etc. can help students find out about the many programs they are eligible for and learn how to win at the financial aid game."
