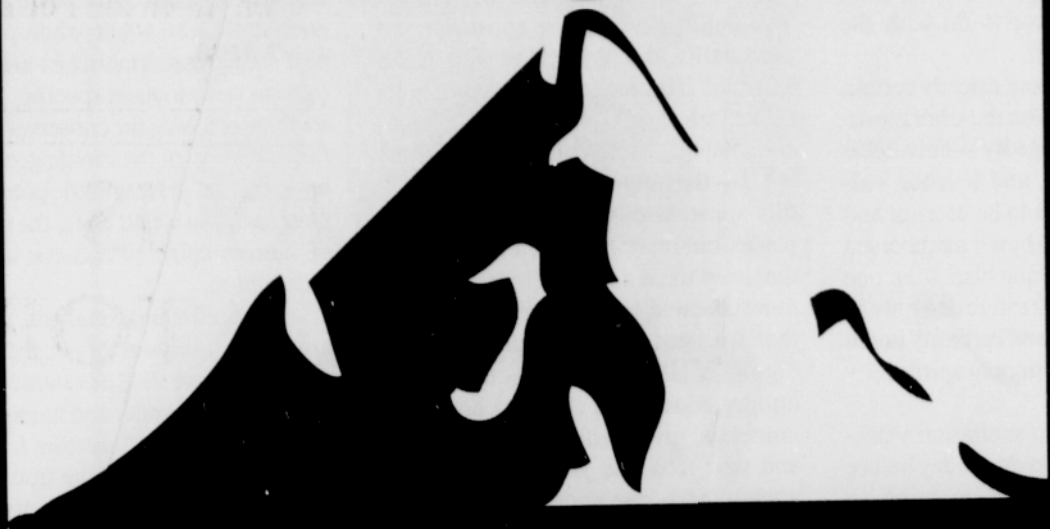


Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., August 23, 1963
