Campaign For Human Development

The Campaign for Human Development is the US Catholic Bishops' education-action program to combat poverty in the United States. The purpose of CHD in Western Oregon is to provide support and assistance to lowincome community groups involved in self-help and practical social change for the common good.

Ten projects in Western Oregon have very recently received grants from the Campaign for Human Development. These projects include: Rogue Valley Fair Share, Southern Oregon (\$20,000); The Coalition of Black Men, Portland (\$2,125): Convenio de Raices Mexicanas, Phoenix (\$2,125); Sojourner Truth Theater Company, Portland (\$2,125); Rogue Valley Community Development Corp., Southern Oregon (\$1,500); New Outlooks Regarding the Homeless, Medford (\$2,125); Oregon Reforestation Cooperative, Salem (\$2,125); Portland Organizing Project (\$2,125); Hotel Workers Organizing Committee, Portland (\$2,125); Powers Hotel Project, North Bend (\$2,125);

Across the country, CHD funded over 200 projects in 1992 in the amount of over 7 million dollars. As the largest funder of its kind in the country, CHD has key criteria for project eligibility: 1. The project must benefit a poverty

2. Members of the poverty group must have the dominant voice in the

3. Projects must work to bring about institutional change by attacking the basic social, economic and political causes of poverty.

The annual appeal to support CHD takes place at all the Masses in the Catholic parishes of Western Oregon on the weekend of January 17, 1993. Catholic parishioners in the Archdiocese have shown strong support for CHD, raising over \$103,000 last year. The Archdiocesan goal this year is \$110,000.
