## AT&T Long Distance Shootout

Five of the NBA's top three-point shooters so far this season—Drzen Petrovic of New Jersey, Mark Price of Cleveland, Dennis Scott of Orlando, Kenny Smith of Houston and Chris Mullin of Golden State—will be joined by three-time defending champion Craig Hodges, currently and unrestricted free agent, Dana Barros of Seattle and B.J. Armstrong of Chicago in the AT&T Long Distance Shootout on NBA All-Star Saturday, February 20 in Salt Lake City.

"Even though Craig Hodges is not currently on an NBA roster, there has been a lot of interest expressed in seeing him get the chance to defend his title in this event," said NBA Vice President, Operations Rod Thorn. "The issue was discussed with the National Basketball Players Association so the we could discern how active NBA players would feel about this participation, and their reaction was that they thought it would be a great idea."

Hodges, along with Larry Bird (1986-88), is one of only two players ever to win the AT&T Long Distance Shootout three times.

Coach Dennis Carline said that guards Nicole Bradford and Melissa Hubbert played a great game, without scoring from the field, but played outstanding defense and very good ball handling in Fridays game with Grant. The score was 59 to 25. Again Udaha led the way with 18 points, while Watts added 12.

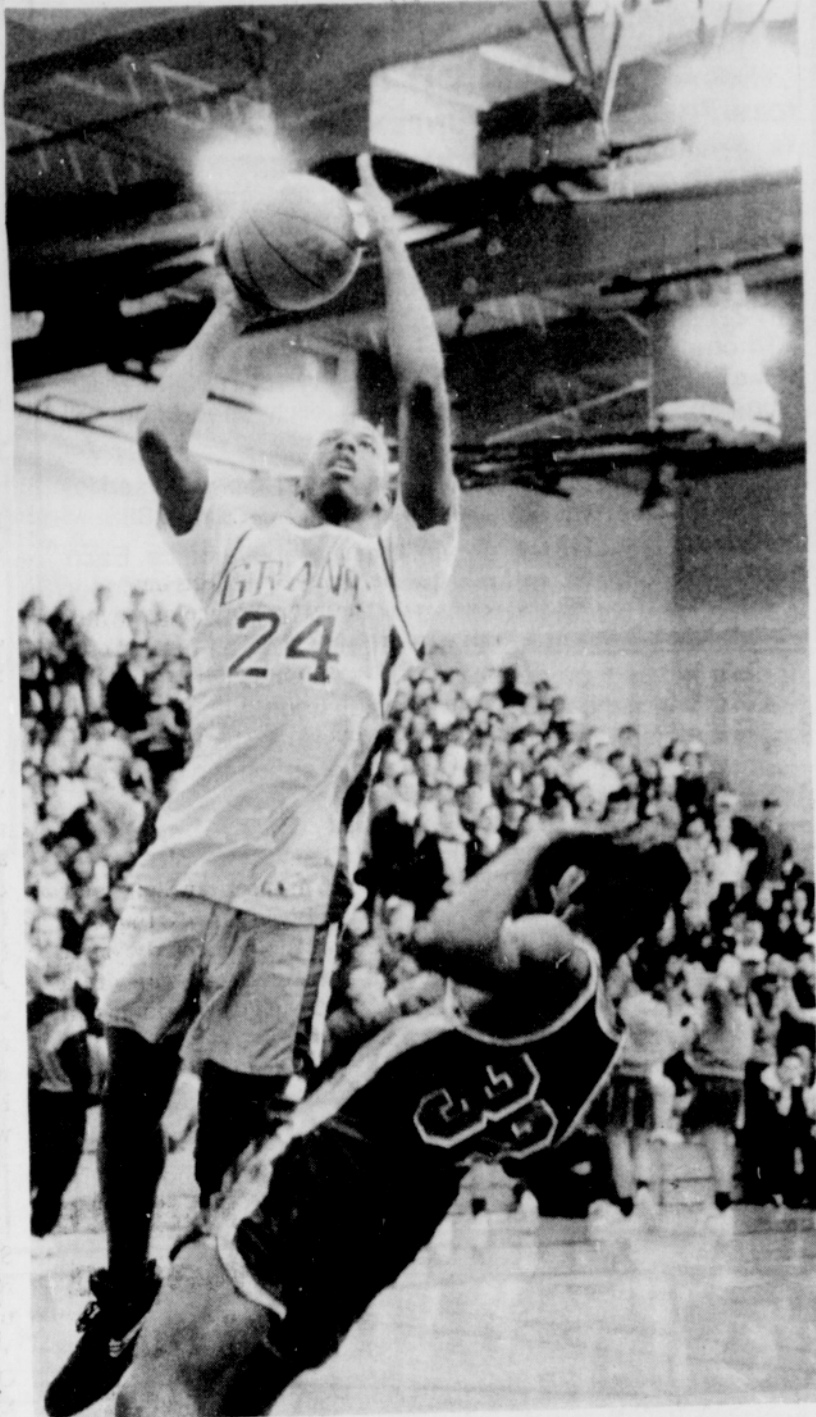
Wilson came back after losing to Benson, with a 61 to 41 win over Cleveland. Clair Cox led the way with 12 after having only 5 against Benson.

### Blazers Stay In School Campaign Kicked Off

The Portland Trail Blazers tipped off their 1993 NBA Stay in School campaign Monday, January 25th when Cliff Robinson and former NBA player and Blazers community activities coordinator Nick Jones visited George Middle School for a rally. Approximately 600 sixth, seventh and eighth grade students attended the assembly.

The NBA effort was organized to encourage students to stay in school and complete their high school education. The focus of the assembly was to instill PRIDE in students. Jones and Robinson brought the message home through a simple but direct presentation of outlining the letters of the word PRIDE. 'P' stands for Positive Mental Attitude; 'R' stands for Respect; 'I' stands for intelligent Decision Making; 'D' stands for Dreaming Dreams and Goal Setting; 'E' stands for Effort in Education.

A total of 10 visits are scheduled during the remainder of the regular season with a different Trail Blazer player accompanying Jones at each assembly. A random drawing of Portland-area middle schools was held to determine which schools would be awarded an assembly.

The Stay in School program, now in its fourth year, is a joint initiative of the NBA, its member teams, the National Basketball Players Association and the National Basketball Coaches Association.
