One might ask what is MYCAP? Well, MYCAP stands for Minority Youth Concerns Action Program. MYCAP provides temporary shelter for youth who do not have appropriate alternative housing. It also provides direct case management with numerous additional youth who are living in the community rather than at the MYCAP facility. Each of the youth have access to all of MYCAP's services.

Some of the services provided by MYCAP is alternative school, street law courses, pre-employment counseling, job placement program, summer community revitalization, peer, family and community support, drug and alcohol abuse counseling, African American male connections program, and a program called Family; families as models instilling leadership in our youth.

MYCAP operates under the working assumption that these young men, in order to make real and lasting changes in their lives, need intervention and stabilization, not simply incarceration. Detention does not necessarily help youth develop all the coping skills they need in society. SIX TIPS FOR CUTTING FAT
