KXL Newsradio 750 AM was the first radio or television station in the Northwest with word of the March 25th earthquake. Morning anchors Steve Leader and Claudia Marshall were on the air at 5:34am when the

quake hit, providing anxious listeners with continuous emergency coverage throughout the morning. Northwest listeners received the latest on the quake's magnitude, emergency information from law enforcement and util-

ity officials in the greater Portland area, and damage updates from KXL's 20-member news team reporting live from Molalla, Newberg, Scotts Mills, Dayton, downtown Portland, Wood-

burn and Salem. KXL's three-member traffic team steered listeners around the trouble spots. KXL listeners were also given a chance to share their quake stories live on the air. KXL Newsradio 750 AM is Portland's ONLY Live 24-hour ALL NEWS and INFORMATION source.
