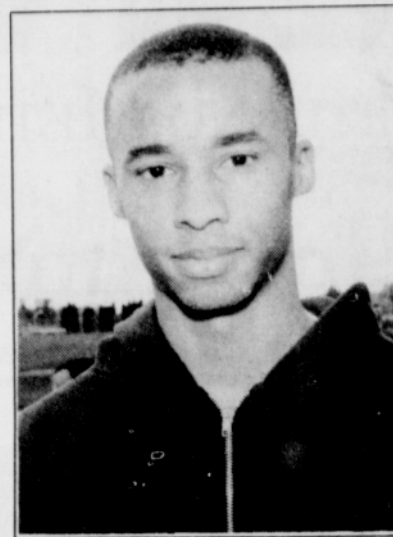

The Observer Players Of The Week



James Ward is this weeks Portland Observer male "Player Of The Week". Ward from Wilson High School, won the 100 and 200 meters and helped win the 1600 meter relay as Wilson beat Benson in a dual track meet 81-64.



Misty Snow of Benson is the Portland Observer female "Player Of The Week". Snow won both hurdles races, the long jump and the triple jump. Benson won the dual track meet over Wilson 77-58 behind Snow.

Robinson Sixth-Man Favorite: Also Bids For Most Improved Player Award

Cliff Robinson continues to get the strong favorite to win the NBA's Sixth Man Award heading into the final month of the 1992-93 season. His name is also being mentioned prominently for the league's Most Improved Player Award.

Robinson has been the Trail Blazers' top player consistently throughout the season. He ranks second on the team in scoring (19.0) and rebounding (6.8), first in blocked shots (1.87) and fourth among the regulars in field goal shooting (.479). His 31.2 minutes played average ranks fourth-even though he's started only 10 of 68 contests. He has outscored and outrebounded all of his competitors for the Sixth Man Award.

The fourth-year forward is making a strong bid to become the second Blazer in five years to top the balloting for the Most Improved Player Award. Kevin Duckworth won the honor following the 1987-88 season. Robinson has significantly raised his averages in scoring (from 12.4 to 19.0 points a game), rebounding (5.1 to

6.8), shot blocking (1.30 to 1.87), field goal accuracy (.466 to .479) and free throw shooting (.664 to .682) from a year ago. He has recorded career highs in every offensive statistical category.

Robinson, who has brought the headband back in style in Portland, has scored 20 or more points in 35 games, including a career-high game (22 points) he brought into this season on 22 occasions. Entering the month of April, Robinson has charted 13 double-doubles of points and rebounds.

Blazers Guard Terry Porter Urges Alcohol Free Prom/Graduation Parties

Each spring, thousands of area teenagers celebrate an important achievement-graduation from high school. All throughout Oregon and southwest Washington seniors are planning their prom and graduation parties to mark this important milestone.

For the third straight year, Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Oregon is joining forces with the Portland Trail Blazers to create a public awareness campaign that addresses the hazards of drinking and driving and encouraging graduating seniors to celebrate their achievement without alcohol. This year, KGW-TV has joined in the initiative and the program's focus has been expanded to include both prom and graduation celebrations as well as all public and private high schools in Oregon and southwest Washington.

Trail Blazers guard Terry Porter is serving as regional spokesperson for "Celebration Prom/Graduation." He will appear in a public service announcement (PSA) that delivers a personal message to stu-

dents about the hazards of mixing drinking and driving.

As part of their support of this effort, Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Oregon, The Blazers and KGW-TV, are offering the first 200 schools that pledge to celebrate their prom and/or graduation without alcohol a Trail Blazers' autographed team pennant that can be used as a fundraising tool. According to Christee Sweeney, Trail Blazers director of corporate communications, many organizations have successfully coordinated raffles and silent auctions using the pennants and have raised between \$300-\$1000. Schools responding after the 200 pennant limit has been exceeded will receive a \$100 donation towards their alcohol free party.

Special "Congratulations Class of '93" banners will be provided to schools that pledge an alcohol free prom/graduation celebration. KGW-TV will also recognize their senior classes through a special PSA scheduled to air in June.

To apply, schools simply need to send a brief letter on school or prom/

graduation committee stationary, indicating that the students have pledged to celebrate their prom/graduation without alcohol, to: PROM/GRADUATION PARTY, Portland Trail Blazers, 700 N.E. Multnomah, Suite 600, Portland, OR, 97232. All applications must be signed by an authorized school representative and need to be postmarked by April 23, 1993. Any party or parties must be officially endorsed by the parents Association or school principal.

The "Celebration Prom/Graduation" program is an initiative of the National Association of Broadcasters (NAB), and TEAM (Techniques for Effective Alcohol Management), a coalition of national sports leagues, businesses, government agencies and other organizations. Porter's teammate, Clyde Drexler, serves as the national spokesperson for "Celebration Prom/Graduation."

Businesses and concerned citizens are encouraged to find out how they can support responsible prom/graduation celebrations by contacting their local high schools.

Columbia Sport Salmon Season Extension Considered

Fisheries managers from the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife and the Washington Department of Fisheries scheduled a teleconference for 1pm Monday, March 29, to consider whether or not to extend sport salmon fishing on the Columbia River.

The season, scheduled to close March 31, may be extended through the weekend if fishery managers decide there is little or no risk to a race of spring chinook bound for the Snake River and listed under the federal Endangered Species Act.

Sport catches have been very low, according to the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife, and incidental catches of listed salmon stocks has been well below a "no-jeopardy" incidental catch level defined by the National Marine Fisheries Service.

Active-Summer Show Features 'First Taste Of Summer' Run

The "First Taste of Summer Run" again will be a major attraction of the third annual Coors Active and Summer Sports Show.

The three-day Active-Summer Sports Show is set April 16-18 at the Multnomah County Exposition Center. The eight kilometer First Taste race will be Saturday, April 17, at 8am.

The run will start at the Expo Center and cover newly paved roads to Portland International Speedway where it will loop the auto race track and return to the start line at the Expo Center.

Rollerbladers will follow the same route as the runners, said Dan Schindler of Trade Shows West and manager of the Active-Summer Sports Show, but will start the in-line skate race in front of the runners.

Several hundred runners and rollerbladers participated in the event last year, according to Schindler.

In addition, a special one-half mile "Fun Run" for youngsters 10 and under also has been scheduled, Schindler noted.

The event is sanctioned and produced by the Oregon Road Runners Club. Prizes for the run include \$250 cash and \$50 gift certificates for first place finishers in five age groups. Second placers will win \$100.

Race entrants will be admitted free to the Active and Summer Show, Schindler said.

Entry fee is \$13, which includes an event T-Shirt, or \$6 without the shirt.
