Earthquake Hazard Maps Available To The Public

will have available a newly-released earth-quake hazard map and two accompanying technical reports beginning April 1.

The map outlines areas most likely to be affected during an earthquake but focuses only on a small portion of the metropolitan region. That small portion--called The Portland Quardrangle--was the subject of a year-long pilot project by the Oregon Department of Geology and Mineral Industries.

The quadrangle is within the city of Portland. The northern boundary is the Columbia River. The westand the southern boundary is Marquam Hill and Tibbetts Street.

Metro and the Department of Geology and Mineral Industries recently received \$700,000 in federal funds to expand the pilot project. The additional portions of the region adjacent to the Portland quadrangle within the next two months. Studying the entire region depends on continued federal funding.

Cost of the map and accompanying technical reports is \$10, which covers a small portion of the two agencies' staff time and material costs.


