(Yunoka Doyle)—a model student several years his junior—to help him understand all those "X's and Y's." To protect his pride, Malcolm insists that Sharon keep their arrangement a secret, especially from her brother and his best friend, Doug (Doug E. Doug).

Despite the low-profile of the tutoring sessions, Kwanzie (Jason Bose Smith), the 10-year-old neighbor kid in love with Sharon, spies the two meeting secretly on several different occasions, and convinces Doug that his baby sister and his best friend are having a love affair. Armed with Kwanzie's information, Doug decides to pull the plug on Sharon and

Malcolm's romance by letting his parents in on their little secret.

"Where I Live," a Michael Jacobs production in association with Touchstone Television, also stars Sullivan Walker, Lorraine Toussaint, and Flex.
