Sterling Macer's hilarious wisecracks are scene stealers n "Dragon: The Bruce Lee Story." He portrays Jerome Sprout, Lee's first pupil and subsequent friend. By teaching Jerome and other non-Chinese students the techniques of kung fu, which the Chinese elders forbid outside their community, Lee pays dearly.

"Jerome is based on a real person in Bruce Lee's life. I understand he now lives in the Seattle area," Macer says. "I was thrilled to get the role. I am not a real martial arts expert, but I know enough to get me in trouble."

Macer's successful acting career bridges the gap between theartre, film and television. Television fans rememberhim, most recently, as Robert Davis in the critically-acclaimed ABC television drams "Homefront." Macer portrayed a young World War II veteran who brings his French war bride back to his hometown, where they experience prejudice as a result of their racially-mixed marriage. Macer will soon be seen in a new

CBS pilot "Hearts of the West," starring with Lloyd Bridges and his son, Beau. Macer describes the show as "present day dude ranch." He plays an ex-attorney who lost his job for insider trading and goes to the ranch to find inner peace. Macer also had a guest starring role in "Star Trek" this season. His family is close-knit, with his parents encouraging him to pursue his dreams, telling him that with hard work he could be anything he wanted.
