Artists Celebrate 20 Years At Saturday Market

In June of 1974, thirty-five local artists gathered together to sell their crafts and began a Portland tradition. As Portland Saturday Market marks its twentieth year of operation this year, fourteen artists are celebrating the two decade mark with the Market.

Thousands of artists have gotten their start at the Market over the years. Entertainers such as The Flying Karamozov Brothers, went on to the big time. Craft vendors, such as Northwest Futons, went on to open their own shops and studios. But fourteen vendors have stuck with the Market for twenty years. Mary Ann Dabritz and Mike Kelley are two of those artists.

Determined to become self-employed, Dabritz began her business of bronze and silver lost wax casting without ever taking an art class. Dabritz custom creates one to five inch figures. Her most popular are moving music figurines that interact.

Salemite Mike Kelley, alias Spoonman, has also been part of the market for two decades. His unique jewelry and home accessories made from spoons, forks and other flatware has expanded into a mail order business.
