Bavarian police said Petrovic was a passenger in a Volkswagen Golf and was travelling with two women from Munich when the car skidded on a rain-slicked highway and slammed into a trailer truck. The accident was just after 5 p.m. German time and occurred on the Autobahn as all three were headed to the 1992 Croatian silver medal-win-Munich.

Police said Petrovic was sitting in the front passenger seat when the driver of the car lost control. The car then hit a guardrail separating oncoming traffic and then smashed into the truck. Both 23-year-old women sustained serious injuries.

Petrovic led the Nets in scoring this past season at 22.3 points per game. He was also 11th in the NBA


