The Portland Branch N.A.A.C.P. Afro-Academic Cultural Technological and Scientific Olympics (i.e. ACT-SO) Program announced its local winners on Sunday, June 12th at a program hosted by Allen Temple CME. A delegation of eight students and five adult chaperons will leave for Indianapolis, ID., the site of the N.A.A.C.P. National Convention, on July 8, 1993.

"ACT-SO is the N.A.A.C.P.'s way of promoting academic excellence by creating a climate in Portland, and other urban cities, where adults actively support academic achievement throughout the community," said Lucious Hicks ACT-SO Chairman.

ACT-SO students compete in 24 academic areas. Each student is allowed to enter up to three categories. Winners represent Portland at the NAACP's National Convention by entering the National ACT-SO Competi-

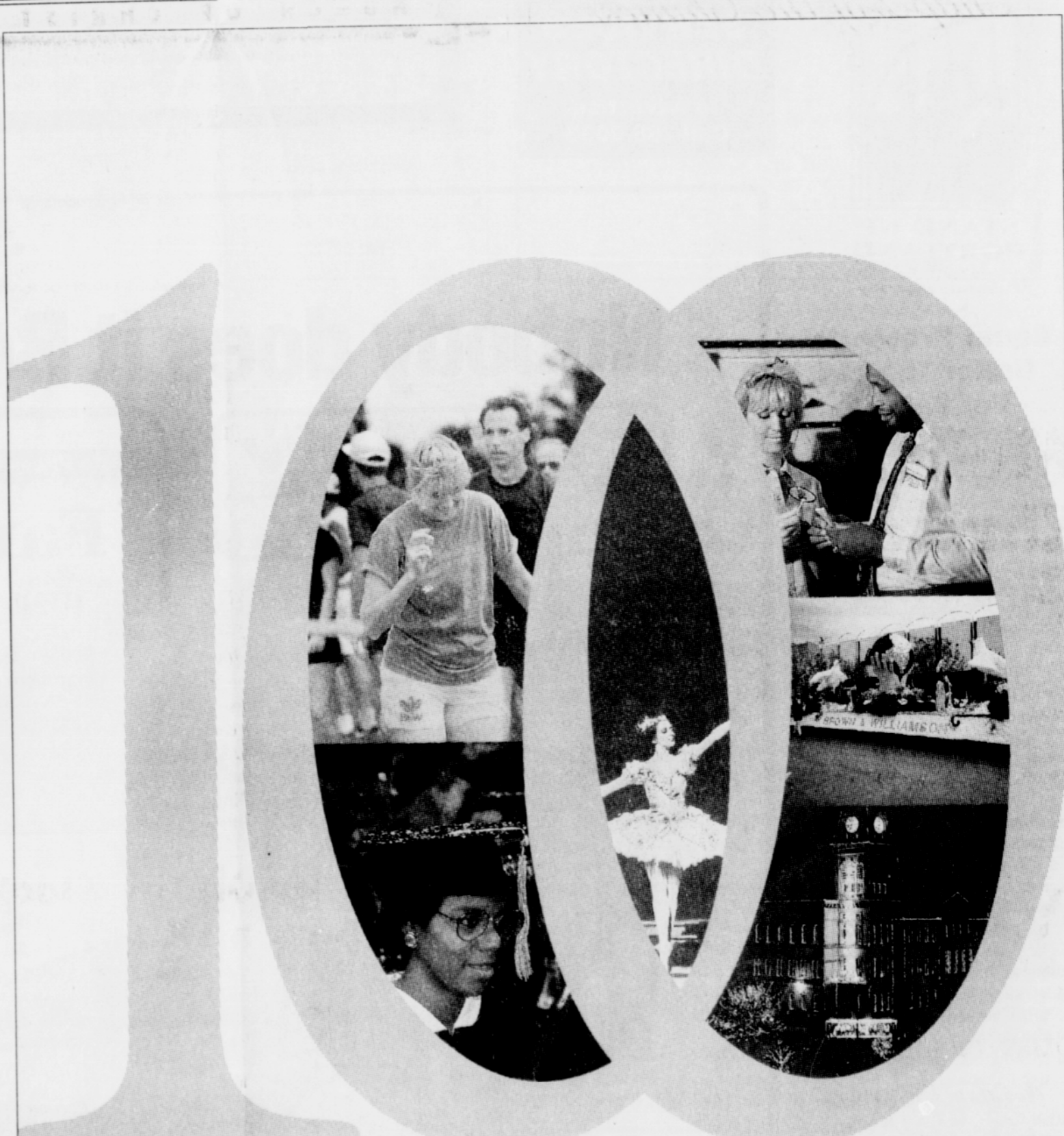
tions. Last year, Nkenge Harmon, a senior at Catlin Gable won a national Gold Medal in Original Essay.
