Grantwriting Workshop

The Black United Fund of Oregon will hold its monthly Community Forum on Wednesday, June 30, 1993, 9:00 am - 12:00 noon at the Martin Luther King, Jr. Branch of U.S. Bank located at 5505 NE M.L. King Jr. Blvd.

This month's workshop, entitled "Secrets to Successful Grantwriting" is being presented by Michael Wells, a consultant that specializes in non-profit fundraising. This workshop will cover selected aspects of grantsmanship including how to identify appropriate funding sources and how to prepare for the grantwriting process. It will also offer information on what to include in a successful grant proposal.

Michael Wells has over twenty years experience working with nonprofits to solve organizational and fundraising problems. He brings strong skills in grantwriting, developing new fundraising programs, analyzing current programs and suggesting improvements, training staff and boards, and implementing programs. Mr. Wells has written over \$3 million of successful grant proposals.

The Multnomah County Book Mobile will be visiting from 1:00 - 4:00 p.m. with a great selection of reading materials.

The Ramblin Rod Show will start promptly at 2 p.m. Kids and parents are encouraged to arrive by 1:30 p.m. for good seating. Depending upon weather conditions, attendance is expected to be between 750-1,000 people. The program is taped and will air later on KPTV Channel 12. diverse mix of lively and informative entertainment from June 30 through August 18, 1993. Admission is just \$3 per car for this community service event hosted by Multnomah County Parks Division.

Portland Public Schools Serves Free Lunches To 4,600 Summer Program Students

Some 4,600 youngsters will receive free lunches and snacks this summer at 37 Portland-area youth centers and parks in a federally funded Summer Food Service program that begins June 21 and runs through Aug. 19.

Portland School District's central kitchen will produce daily meals for students under age 19 participating in educational enrichment programs, recreation and craft programs

and field trips. Meals, sponsored by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, are provided to all children participating in the programs listed on the attached page. Specific information on site locations is available from the Portland Park Bureau or by calling the school district's Nutrition Services Department, 331-3366.

Portland Public Schools has participated in this federal program for 24 years.

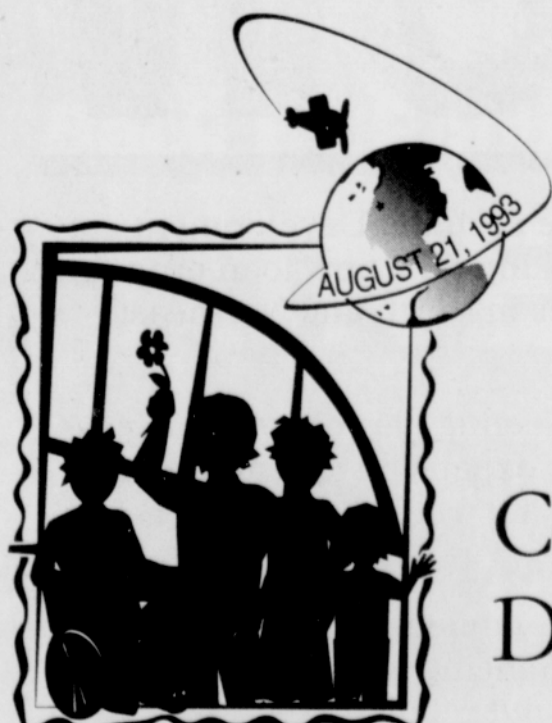
