Oregon Weekly Unemployment **Benefit Amounts To** Be Increased

Weekly unemployment benefit amounts will go up slightly in Oregon on July 4, 1993.

The maximum benefit per week The camps will be run by the will be \$285 and the minimum benefit per week will be \$66. The current maximum and minimum benefit amounts are \$271 and \$63. The change affects new employment insurance

claims filed on or after July 4. The calculation of benefits is done on an annual basis and is required by law. It is based on a percentage of the average wages paid in Oregon. Frank Richey, Manager, Unemployment Insurance Program Analysis, says the reason for the increase is that Oregon average wages are up slightly.

The number of individuals who received unemployment benefits checks in 1992 was 207,890.


