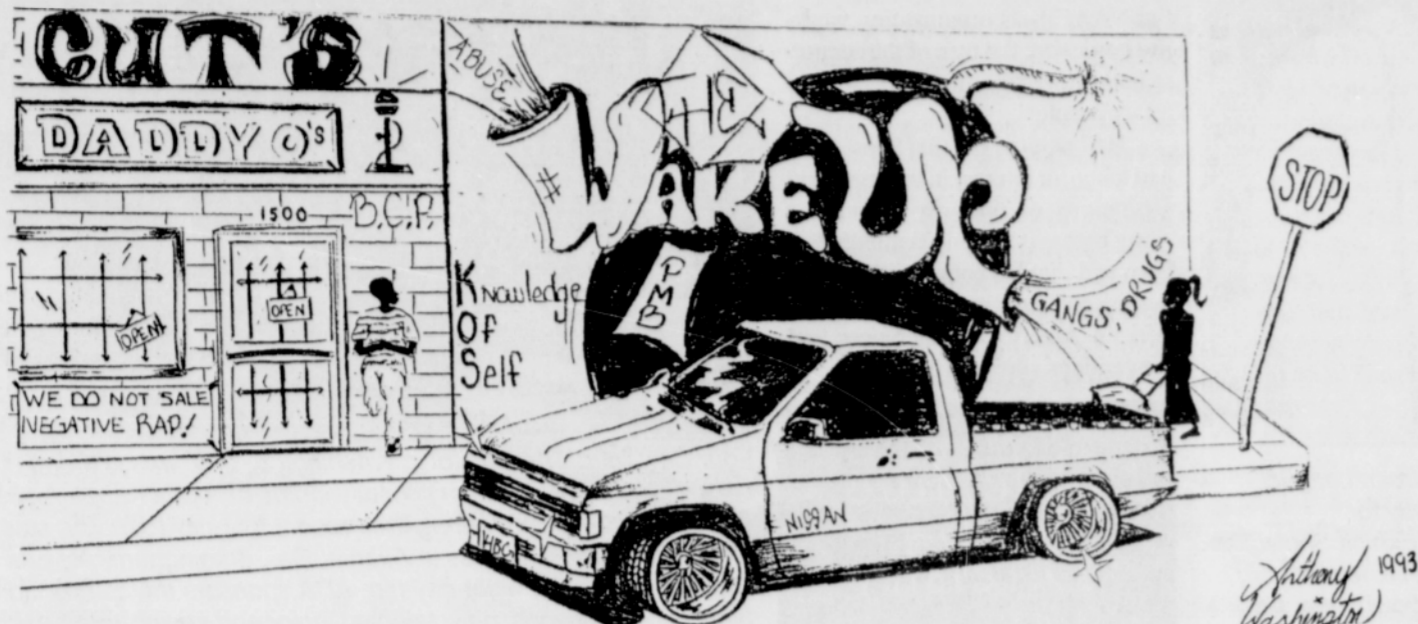

Maynard's Formula

November 1991.

Maynard's formula for community involvement was simple: Just do it. He taught at local high schools, attended community forums, organized relief for babies of cocaine addicted mothers, victims of Loma Prieta earthquake and the East Bay hills firestorm and helped establish youth forums in the city's churches in the aftermath of Rodney King. His newspaper crusaded for improved schools, trauma care centers, economic development and better communication across cultural lines. "A newspaper," he wrote in 1979, in his first Letter from the Editor column, should be "an instrument of community understanding."

His journalism career began in 1961 at daily newspaper in York, Pennsylvania. In 1965, he received a Nieman fellowship to Harvard University. In 1992, Maynard's daughter, journalist Dori J. Maynard, became the first woman in history to follow her father to Harvard as a Nieman fellow.

After Harvard, Bob Maynard

covered civil rights and urban unrest as a national correspondent for the Washington Post. He later became the newspaper's ombudsman. It was in Washington, D.C. that he met his bride-to-be, then New York Times reporter Nancy Hicks. They were married 20 years ago.

Maynard was first diagnosed with prostate cancer in 1988. It went into remission twice, but returned a third time in 1992 and was a factor in the family's decision to sell the newspaper.

Even through his illness, Maynard was the quintessential optimist. "The country's greatest achievements came about because somebody believed in something whether it was in a steam engine, an airplane or a space shuttle," he once wrote "Only when we lose hope in great possibilities are we really doomed. Reversals and tough times inspire some people to work harder for what they believe in."

Robert C. Maynard is survived by his wife, Nancy Hicks Maynard, daughter, Dori J., sons David and Alex, and four brothers and sisters.

Annual Aids Pledge Walk Three Weeks Away

One of Oregon's largest annual AIDS fundraisers is just three weeks away. The "From All Walks of Life" pledge walk is scheduled for Sunday, September 12. Anyone interested but not yet signed up to walk or make a donation can contact the WALK office at 223-WALK.

This year's WALK features a new 6.2 route mile which begins and ends at Tom McCall waterfront park and tours through downtown and Northwest Portland. The WALK promises to be fun as well as worthwhile, with each rest stop featuring surprises for the walk-

ers. Registration and pre-walk activities begin at 8 A.M. when Starbucks will be providing free coffee to walkers. The WALK itself begins at 10 A.M. and post-WALK activities begin at noon with music by Calvin Walker & Friends, foot massages, and prizes.

Last year's WALK brought 3,000 walkers and over a quarter million dollars to Cascades AIDS Project and five other non-profit beneficiaries that provide AIDS care and education. This year, WALK organizers expect to raise nearly \$350,000.

University Of Portland Students Take "Freshman Plunge"

More than a dozen University Portland students will begin their fall semester by rehabilitating houses in Northeast Portland. Students will start the two-day plunge Saturday, August 28, prior to the start of fall semester registration on Monday.

The students will spend days with hammers and paint brushes at a N.E. Alberta Street and Ninth Avenue

home. They will use their evenings to study the University's role in addressing social problems.

The first-ever Freshman Plunge is modeled after the University's successful annual Urban Plunge in downtown and rural Plunge in Washington County migrant camps.

The University of Portland is Oregon's Catholic University and has

been closely affiliated for 90 years with the Congregation of Holy Cross, Notre Dame, Ind. The University is one of the largest, private higher education institutions in the Pacific Northwest.
