North Carolina, winner of the 1993 Peach Bowl, and USC, with John Robinson returning to the sidelines as head coach, will meet in the fourth Disneyland Pigskin Classic in Anaheim Stadium on August 29, with kick-off at 6pm pacific time. The game will also be televised by Raycom Sports.

The announcement of the matchup was made by Disneyland president Jack Lindquist during a news conference back in March.

"We are pleased to have these two outstanding universities in the Disneyland Pigskin Classic," Lindquist said. "They represent the finest in intercollegiate football tradition, ranking one-two in the nation in 1000-yard rushers.

North Carolina was represented by head coach Mack Brown, beginning his sixth season as the Tar Heel's head coach. North Carolina was 9-3 last year, defeating Mississippi State, 21-17, in The Peach Bowl in Atlanta on January 2, 1993. Robinson, returning to USC after nine years with the Los Angeles Rams and one as a commentator for CBS sports, noted that he was anxious to open the season against a team of Carolina's calibre.

"This is a team likely to be in the pre-season top 10 in the country," Robinson said. They have a majority of their offensive starters returning and should be a force in the Atlantic Coast Conference this year."

USC has been of the most respected football programs in the nation," said Brown in accepting the invitation. They have a rich athletic heritage and we are thrilled to be playing the Trojans."

The two schools have produced forty 1000-yard rushers between them, with North Carolina having 21 and

USC 19. Amos Lawrence is the Tar Heel's all-time leading rusher with 4319 yards, while Charles White gained 6517 yards for USC.

This will be the fourth Disneyland Pigskin Classic, the second straight in which a former PAC-10 Coach returned to the pack for his first game back.

Last season Bill Walsh marked his return as head coach at Stanford when the Cardinal bowed to Texas

A&M, 10-7. Florida State defeated BYU, 44-28, in 1991, while Colorado and Tennessee played to a 31-all tie in the 1990 inaugural game.

This summer's game a battle of returning standout quarterbacks in the second-ever meeting of the two schools (1958, North Carolina 8, USC 7). Rob Johnson begins his junior year of eligibility for USC having thrown for 12 touchdowns and 2023 yards last season. He hit on 156 passes in 267 attempts.

Carolina used a tandem of quarterbacks in Jason Stanicek and Mike Thomas. The duo threw for 1913 yards (Stanicek 1082 and Thomas 831) and seven touchdowns. In addition, Thomas handles Carolina's punting duties, being named to the freshman All-American team with a 43.1 yard average.

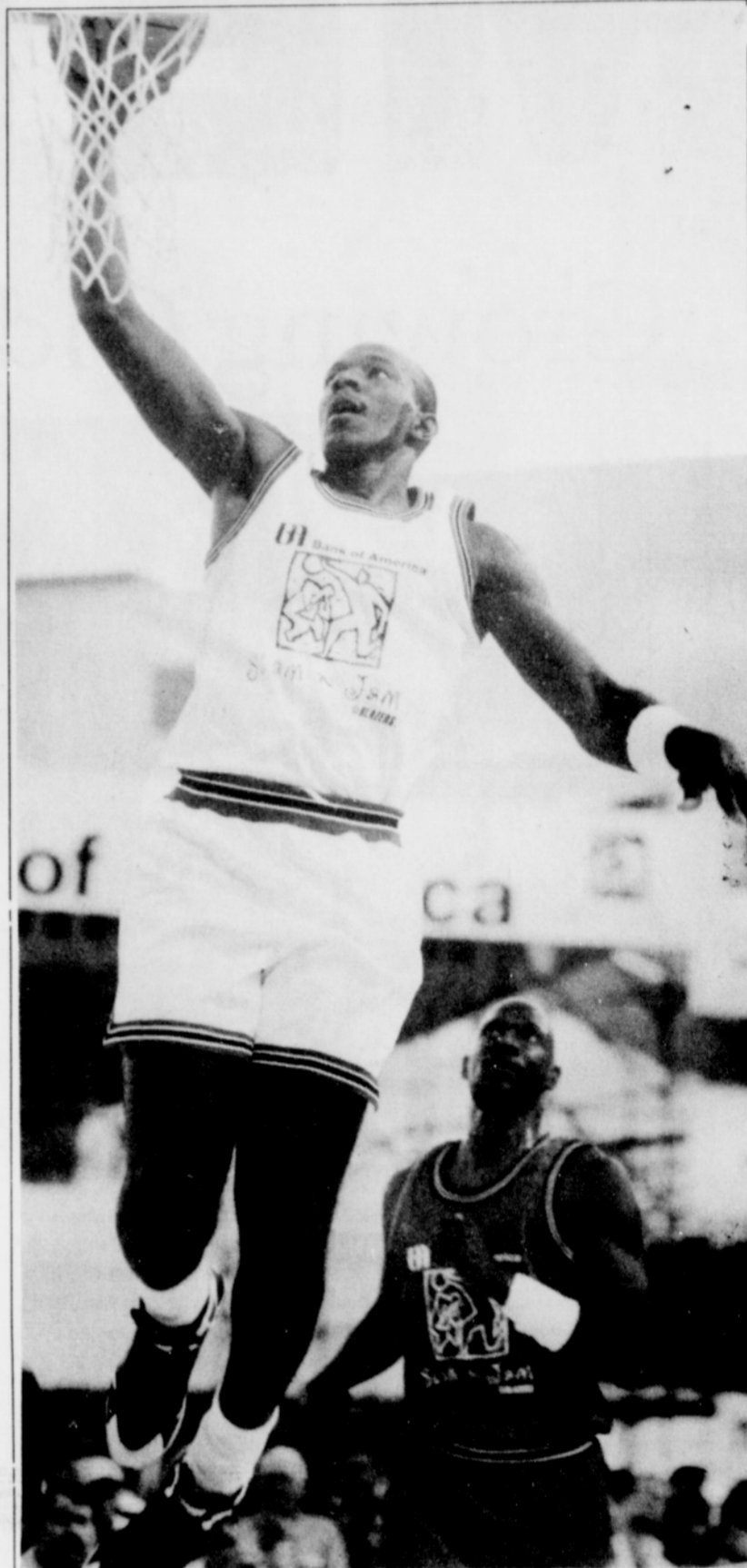
Robinson's previous stint at USC ran from 1976 to 1982 and included a national championship in 1978. His record was 67-14-2 with five bowl appearances.

Brown's record at Carolina is 24-31-1, but the last three teams have been 6-4-1, 7-4 and 9-3 after back-to-back 1-10 marks his first two years. Brown served as head coach at Tulane prior to taking the Tar Heel job.

"We want to make this one of the best games of the college season," said Robinson, "I expect a standing-room-only crowd with the Trojans fans out in force."

"We're excited," echoed Brown. "It is a tremendous challenge to face a team like the university of Southern California. It will be like a home game for them."
