## Notice Of Public Hearing

Notice is hereby given that a public hearing will be held by the Tri-County Metropolitan Transportation District of Oregon (Tri-Met) at 3:30 p.m. Wednesday, September 29, 1993, at the Portland Building, 1120 SW 5th Avenue, 2nd floor, room C, for the purpose of considering projects for which federal assistance under Section 3 of the Federal Transit Act is being sought.

The project under consideration is Westside Light Rail. Tri-Met received federal approval to design and construct the rail project in September 1992. This grant application will request fiscal year 1994 discretionary funds totalling \$138,666,666; \$104,000,000 federal share with \$34,666,666 local match.

The Westside Light Rail project begins at the terminus of the existing Max line at SW 11th Avenue in downtown Portland and extends west to SW 185th Avenue in Washington County. Included in this proposal is funding for right-of-way acquisition; completion of final design on line sections and systems including the Operations facility, traction electrification system, signals, communications and central control, fare collection; continuation of design coordination with the rail vehicle manufacturer; procurement of track and materials; and overall project administration. Construction is scheduled to begin on the east tunnel portal and several line sections. The grant application also contains a request to integrate art program activities into the project scope.

A discussion of displacement of persons, families and business is included in the Final Environmental Impact Statement for the Westside project.

The project is in conformance with comprehensive land use and transportation planning in the area and is programmed in the region's Transportation Improvement Program.

A statement of Tri-Met's charter bus service is available for inspection at the Tri-Met Administration Office. Tri-Met will not be engaging in school bus operations.

Private transportation enterprise will not be directly affected by the project.

At the hearing, Tri-Met will afford opportunity for interested persons or agencies to be heard with respect to the social, economic, and environmental aspects of the project.

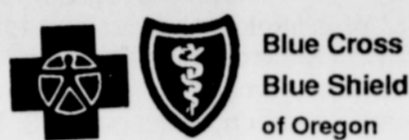
