Benson, Wilson Look Ahead To Showdown

The Benson Techmen and the Wilson Trojans are the only undefeated football team in the Portland Interscholastic League.

Wilson had a hard way to go Friday night at Madison, as the Senators also came in this big game with no defeats. The home crowd was even bigger because it was homecoming night for the Senators. It ended up being a nightmare in the end.

Quarterback Jamie Thorpe scored on a one yard run after a scoreless first half by both teams. That made it 7-0, Wilson. Madison came right back on a Robert Cavil 10 run, but the "Pat" was missed and the Trojans lead was one, at 7-6. Wilson then scored again, this time, Jake Lancaster ran it in from three yards out. But Wilson also missed the "Pat" for 13-6 lead.

Sam Siel, who had 65 yards on 12 carries, scored for the Senators on a 4 yard run. Madison went for the two-point conversion that failed, and Wilson stayed atop the P.I.L. tied with Benson.

Benson had a little easier time in their game with Roosevelt. The Rough

Riders are a lot better than their 0-4 would show. Roosevelt jumped out to a 12-0 lead on a pair of touchdown runs by Greg Diehl, of one and three yards.

Tech then scored 32 big points before Roosevelt could score again. Desmond Faison ran for one T.D. and threw 45 yards to Tauheed Jermany for another. Benson also had touchdowns scored by Patrick Johnson, a 53 yard run, and Chris Beene's 44 yard score. Jon Miller caught a 5 yard pass for Roosevelt's final score.

Again it was powerful running back Dimion Martindale who scored three touchdowns and ran for 226 yards on 27 carries, in a 36-26 win over Jefferson.

Martindale's scores came on runs of 62, 11, and 6 yards. He also ran for a big two-point conversion.

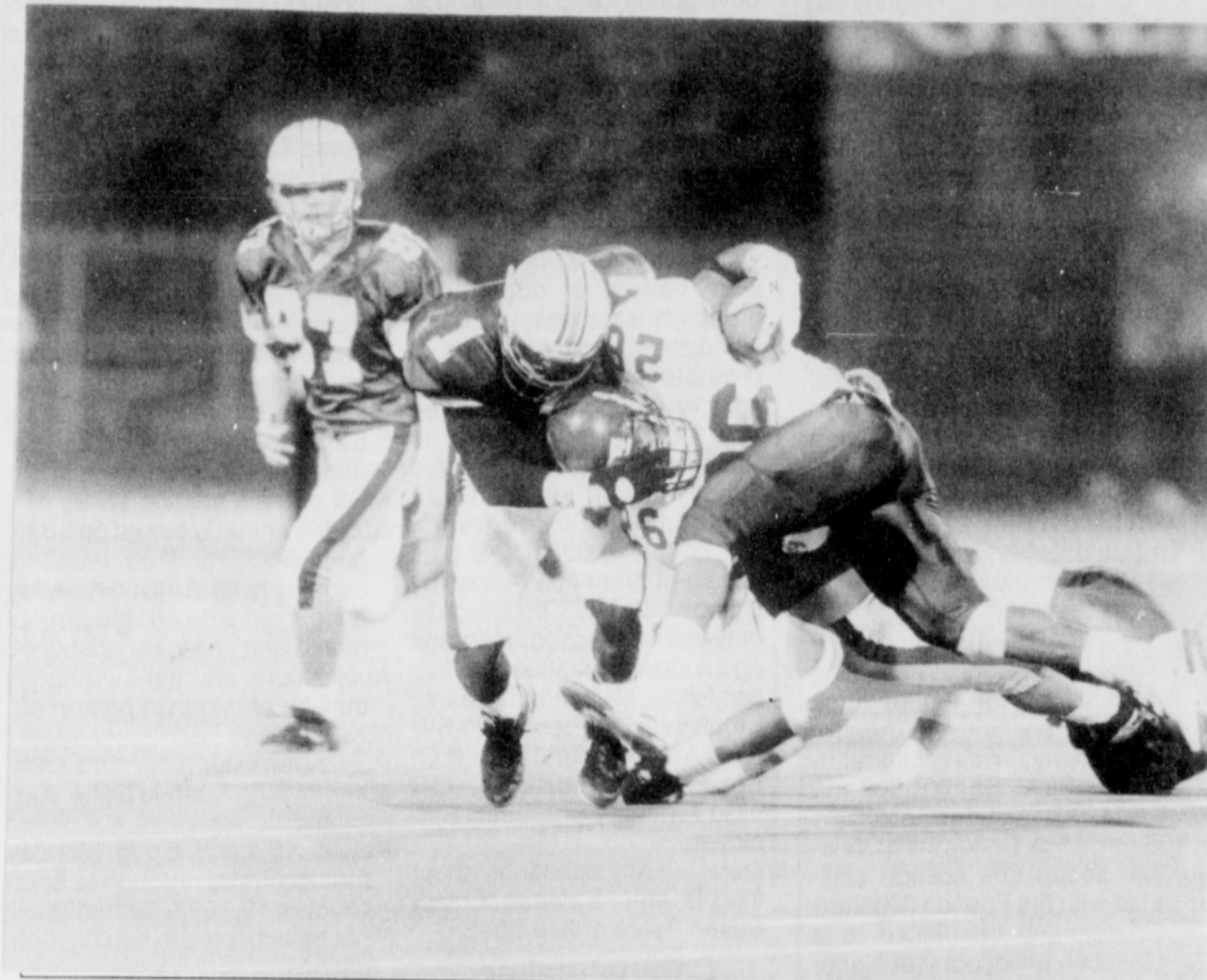
Jefferson's 26 points came on Thomas Jacob's runs of 15 and 55 yards, along with a fumble return by Jochannan Lowe of 60 yards. And Leroy Brandon had a 65 yard punt return for a touchdown.

Robby Buen threw for two scores to Noel Patterson of 29 and 18 yards for

the Minuteman on their home field. Grant scored with ease on the way to a 23-6 win over Cleveland. Keis Brauchamp passed for two touchdowns, the first going to Eric Moten for 49 yards. The other to Rico Waddell for 57 big yards. Waddell then scored on a 10 yard run to close out the scoring for the Generals.

Cleveland's lone score came on a one yard run by Tim Ostrem.

Franklin stayed only one game off the pace, with a 50-22 drilling of Lincoln. Running back Derrick Brame had a very big night with three touchdowns on runs of 3, 9, and 18 yards. Matt Geske also got into the act with two TD's of his own. On runs of one and six yards. Geske also passed for two scores to Tyler White for 19 yards, and 20 yards to Mike Meyer. Lincoln got on the board with a pass from Daniel Ross to David King. Then female kicker Joy Lawrence made the point after touchdown. Good. Kang added a 72 yard run and Christian Swain got into the end zone from 6 yards out.
