The African American business men and women spared no display of emotions, both joy and sorrow to the man who stepped into a Trojan Horse, who's frame was severely broken, where the sunlight peered through one side to the other, and no wheel of hope to move forward.

I think it's very important also to realize that young black men, when they got opportunities to move on, to do it, it's about economic stability, it's about carving out a life for yourself and your family to grow. So for him I'm very glad, for Oregon and in particular Portland I'm very sad because he has done such a good job here, he worked well with the Police Dept. and the youth. He established new programs at The Urban League that were role models".

Lloyd Center Introduces New Safety Plans; Cooperative Effort With Portland Police

Emphasizing that while 90 percent of all security calls at Lloyd Center are for low security problems, mall management today said even one criminal incident is too many and that additional safety measures will be instituted immediately.

General Manager Tim Earnest said that most calls are for temporarily lost children or keys locked in cars. However, two recent incidents made the center a recent media target, subsequently frightening shoppers and causing a downturn in business for mall merchants.

Earnest joined Portland Police Chief Charles Moose and several neighborhood representatives in encouraging shoppers to continue shopping at the city's largest mall.

Introduced at a news conference were several Holiday Safety Guides who will assist customers in various ways and be on the lookout for problems. The Guides will carry radios to call for assistance if needed. Earnest and Chief Moose also presented informa-

nights.

A three-year lighting retrofit plan and the installation of a closed-circuit video monitor system in the parking lots will add to the level of safety at the mall.

Lloyd Center also introduced mounted patrolmen to the mall. The horses and officers will patrol the area much like those in downtown Portland. They have proven to be very popular with the public both as a safety measure and aesthetically.

Police Chief Moose said Portland residents should continue to patronize Lloyd Center and surrounding area businesses. He applauded the cooperation between neighborhood associations, the police and Lloyd Center management.

As a finale to the safety announcements, Lloyd Center introduced McGruff, the crime fighting dog, to kick off a mall-wide Safety Expo October 23 and 24. The free Expo featured many
