NOMINATION DEADLINE APPROACHING

Franklin UPsets, Showdown?

This Friday was to be the big showdown at Wilson High School. Benson and Wilson were going to be unbeaten and the winner would be the champs of the Portland Interscholastic League.

"Not" The Franklin Quakers had something to say about it, and boy did they speak loud.

Franklin, only a 22-21 loser to Wilson early in the season, scored a easy 27-12 victory over The Techman at Portland's Civic Stadium.

If Wilson can beat Benson at home Friday, they will win the P.I.L. out right. If Benson can will their will be a three-way tie for the P.I.L. championship.

Quarterback Matt Geske had a outstanding night playing both offence and defense.

The game started out with a bang. The bang came from Bobby Ray Hill, as he took the opening kick-off and raced 83 yards to put Benson ahead, 6-0.

The Quakers came right back as all-star running back Derrick Brame scored a touchdown from 46 yards

out. Tyler White's kick for extrapoint was good, and a 7-6 lead. The Quakers added to their lead as Geske passed 26 yards to Jarrad Mock, and after White's second pat kick was good, Franklin's lead was 14-6.

Tech came right back again. This time it was behind running back Patrick Johnson, but it was Desmond Faison's one yard run that had the score 14-12 by halftime.

But that was as close as Benson would get as Franklin's defense got tough and kept Tech out of the end zone.

Brame scored again on a one yard run and Geske again hooked up with mock for a 24 yard touchdown.

Brame gained 137 yard on the ground and should be first team all-state. Wilson ran all over Jefferson, 35-0 in a game played on The Demo's home field. David Jackson scored two touchdowns on short runs of 2 and 3 yards. Jason Filertson had a 65 yard touchdown run, while Quarterback Jamie Thorpe passed for two T.D's.

Madison outscored Grant in the first game played at Civic Stadium, 20-12.

The Senators Robert Cavil carried the ball 21 times for 128 yards and a 4 yard touchdown. Sam Siel scored on a one yard run and Doug Ashley passed to Mike Donohoe for a 46 yard touchdown play.

Grant got both of it's touchdowns from Terence James with runs of 3 and 42 yards.

The two games played on Saturday were both shut-outs. Marshall run up the score on Lincoln, 38-0. Damion Martindale added to his state scoring lead by running the two touchdowns on runs of 2 and 36 yards, plus he kick 3 extra points and a 31 yard field goal.

The other shut-out came from the Roosevelt Rough Riders, with a 38-0 white washing of Cleveland.

Joe Duran score on a 15 yard run and a 3 yard pass from Mike Smith. Smith also passed to Richard Capelle for a 21 yard touchdown. The other touchdowns came from Greg Diehl on a 2 yard run. Tavy Kousonsavath ran for 2 yards and David Ferres passed 13 yards to James Young for a Rough Rider score.

Registration forms are now available for the 11th annual Fred Meyer/Blazers Youth Basketball Tournament. Boys and girls in the sixth, seventh and eighth grades that are involved in a registered basketball league in Oregon or southwest Washington are eligible to participate in the competition.

Registration forms for the tournament must be postmarked by December 3, 1993, and can be found at all 46 Fred Meyer Sporting Goods departments, and the Trail Blazers office (700 NE Multnomah, Portland, OR 97232). The entry fee is \$40 per team. A team roster must be submitted with the application and entry fee. Teams cannot exceed 15 players.

This year's tournament includes two divisions: Classic i.e. Jr. Star, AAU and Community i.e. Golden Ball, CYO, YBA.

The tournament, a single-elimination event, will hold its preliminary rounds January 9, 16, and 23, 1994, in Portland. Two teams from each grade level in the Classic or Community division will advance to championship games, which will be played prior to Blazers home games at Memorial coliseum on January 30, February 3 and 8, 1994.

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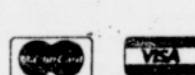
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BLAZER BROADCASTING TO AIR
