Scroggy. "Certified Safety Specialist Kern Austin will be driving the van and performing at least 50 job site inspections per month."

The brightly-painted van has been in operation since October 25, and is equipped with First Aid Kits, hard hats, face shields, protective eyewear, and other required safety equipment. "We start with the Occupational Safety and Health Act (OSHA) codes, and we take them even further," said Austin. "Our company is committed to safety. It's our corporate responsibility to protect the employees, as well as the community."

In addition to the safety equipment, the van will also transport posters and bulletins to keep the site wellmarked, and updated safety reference manuals. A portable TV and VCR are on board along with various injury prevention videos for the crews to view.

"As far as we know, we are the

only electrical construction company in the region with a Safety Van operating and a full-time Certified Safety Specialist," said Linda Miller Woodall, head of Business Development at EC. "As a full service contractor, our strength comes from di-
