Crime Stoppers: Fraud Suspect

Washington County Sheriff's Department Detectives, in cooperation with Crime Stoppers, are asking for your help in identifying and apprehending a subject responsible for a large series of check fraud forgeries in at least two states.

In October 1993, a subject, who claimed to be Sammy Barrera, arrived in Oregon from New Mexico where he wrote over \$20,000 worth of "bad

After obtaining and Oregon State Department of Motor Vehicles Identification Card and opening a checking account, the subject began writing checks to local merchants. During one 3-day-period, from October 22 through the 24th, he wrote at least 45 checks totaling over \$18,000. Based upon the items the suspect bought, investigators believe he is possibly setting up housekeeping somewhere.
