Jerusalem 3000 Celebration

In March of 1994 Portland, Oregon will be the first city in the world to host a major celebration of the 3000th anniversary of Jerusalem. The precise date of King David's establishment of Jerusalem as the capital of Israel is not known but scholars generally agree that it was 996 B.C.E., plus or minus two or three years. Since that time Jerusalem has exerted a more powerful effect upon the spiritual lives of human being than any other city in the world. Jerusalem 3000 will bring to Oregon the beauty, the joy, and the inspiration of this great city. In light of the remarkable developments in the Middle East with the signing of the Peace Accord between Israel and the P.L.O., it is more important than ever to reflect on the universality of Jerusalem and to appreciate its message to humankind. These events were planned by Christians, Jews, and Moslems in the spirit of Jerusalem as a light unto the world for peace and goodwill.

"Visions of Jerusalem," will

open at the Goodman Hall of the Schnitzer Family Center, at Temple Beth Israel, on March 2 and will be open to the public until March 31. Visiting hours are Sunday from 10:AM to 1:00 PM, Tuesday and Thursday 11:00 am to 2:00 pm, and Wednesday evenings from 5:30 pm to 8:30 pm.

The photographic exhibit "Images of Jerusalem" will open at the Mittleman Jewish Community Center on March 3rd. The public is invited to a reception from 6:00-8:00 pm. On Sunday, March 6, an interfaith music concert will be held at St. Mary's Cathedral at 3:00 pm. Two Films of Jerusalem will be shown in the Vollum Lecture Hall of Reed College Tuesday, March 8 at 7:30 pm. They are "Walking Through Jerusalem with Elie Wiesel," and "Jerusalem-National Geographic Society." A lecture series will bring to Portland world renowned scholars of Jerusalem, Dr. Thomas Idinopulos, author of the highly acclaimed book, "Jerusalem Blessed, Jerusalem Cursed" will

speak on Monday March 7 at 7:30 pm in the Holy Trinity Greek Orthodox Church.

Dr. Yehoshua Ben Aryeh, Rector and Professor of Historical Geography at the Hebrew University in Jerusalem will speak Wednesday, March 9 at 7:30 pm in the Templeton Chapel of Lewis and Clark College. Dr. Israel Shatzman, the Director of the Jewish National Hebrew University Library in Jerusalem, will speak Thursday, March 10 at 7:30 pm at Congregation Neveh Shalom.

Two workshops will be given on Tuesday, March 8th at 2:00 pm, at the First United Methodist Church. The subject will be "Jerusalem in World Literature." The second workshop will be Thursday at 2:00 pm at the First United Methodist Church. The subject will be "Jerusalem - A Monotheistic Dialogue." Man Created, Born To Lead; But Must Become Leader

Every election time sees old and new faces of men/women seeking to establish themselves as leaders; some have qualified as true leaders, while others seek to dominate other humans. You must have a deep craving to see something done at the expense of your life; you must have passion for your purpose. You must press to the mark of a new calling. (Ephesians). You must earn the trust of others: How? Earn trust through character. Be faithful. Stand for something. Survive the tests of life. (2 Tim. Ch 2). We have lots of Characters in the Church, but no character. If you want to see professional actors, don't go to Hollywood, come to Church. Trust.....teach God to your children, so that they know what God has done for you.

Purpose of leadership is to produce leaders, not to maintain followers. True leadership works itself out of a job, by producing people who can lead. If a leader is afraid someone will take his job, he is not a true leader,

just an immature, ineffective person (Christian). Effective parents produce effective parents. Jesus said "because I go away, you shall do greater things than I have done". After the resurrection, Jesus said "all authority is in my hands"; Matt 28 "You go and preach the gospel, (I did it in Palestine), you go into all the world". True leaders do not restrict your growth or retard your vision. True leaders find joy when the people who follow him/her, become effective leaders themselves. A true leader expects greater things than he has done from his former followers. Know your purpose for being born; visualize your reason for being here on earth and grow through the trials of life, chafing not against the tests of God; Allow God to chisel you from the rough stone, thus producing from the raw material a person in His image, with a passion to complete his purpose here on the earth given for his domination.

Be wise, take a good look at those who would lead. Compare their character with those who have been through the fires of life; those who have a healthy respect for all people. Do they qualify as leaders? Are they trust worthy? Are they Christ-like in attitudes and deportment? Is their word to be taken as truth? Are they truly mature, visionaries with a purpose that uplifts and builds future leaders?

These standards of character for leaders are not to be altered, but are to be strictly adhered to if we would have effective leadership.

Iona Locke, Winans Aide To Preach Here

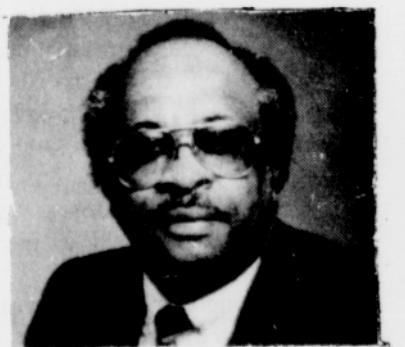
