Epcot '94 Making A Splash, Leads Walt Disney World Into Banner Spring



Maestro Mickey Mouse has the waters dancing to the beats and moods of the music as Epcot '94 showers springtime guests with new entertainment wonders -- all part of a Walt Disney World expansion featuring special musical shows, new and updated attractions, a colorful festival, two themed resort adventures and a music club.

Epcot headlines for springtime guests include a new musical

"splashtacular" that brings the huge CommuniCore fountain to life, "The Magical World of Barbie" musical stage show at America Gardens stage in World Showcase and the inaugural Epcot International Flower and Garden Festival. Epcot news bulletins later in the year: the "Innoventions" showcase of "what's next" on the consumer-products scene; a zany, food-rockin' salute to good nutrition;

and a new dimension to 3-D in "Honey, I Shrank the Theater."

New and updated shows and attractions also await visitors to the Magic Kingdom and Disney-MGM Studios, while the nightlife scene at Pleasure Island continues to grow. By later in the spring, overnight guests will be able to choose new themed accommodations celebrating sports and America's great Western lodges.

Southwest Airlines Announces New Service In Portland

New Flights Mark First Transition of Morris Air to Southwest

Southwest Airlines announced details of its plans to begin service at Portland International Airport on June 6, 1994. The announcement was made by John Denison, Southwest's executive vice president of corporate services, in Portland, along with Robert Ames, president of the Port of Portland Commission, and Vera Katz, mayor of Portland.

The airline will begin service in Portland on June 6 with three daily flights to Spokane, Wash. (\$49 one-way unrestricted fare), and four daily flights to Oakland (\$79 one-way unrestricted fare). For travelers who can plan ahead, Southwest offers advance purchase fully-refundable FUN FARES.

On July 8, Southwest will complement its new service in Portland with three daily flights to Sacramento (\$79 one-way unrestricted fare) and one daily flight to Reno (\$79 one-way unrestricted fare).

Southwest also announced today that it will begin service on June 6 to Seattle with four daily flights to Spokane and four daily flights to Oakland. The airline also will begin service June 6 in Spokane,



Wash., with four daily flights to Seattle, three daily flights to Portland, and one daily flight to Oakland.

On May 26, the airline will begin service in Orange County with 15 daily flights--seven to Oakland and eight to San Jose.

Morris Air, which Southwest acquired on Dec. 31, 1993, will retain its two daily flights between Portland and Boise and two daily flights between Portland and Salt Lake City. Morris also will continue service with two daily flights from Orange County to Salt Lake City; one daily flight between Seattle and Anchorage; one daily flight between Seattle and Boise; three daily flights between Seattle and Salt Lake City; and one daily flight between Oakland and Reno.

The new service will bring to 41 the number of cities served by Southwest Airlines nationwide.

The airline will employ about 45 people at Portland International Airport when the operations are fully staffed. Southwest currently employs more than 13,500 people throughout its system. With this new service, Southwest will serve 41 cities in 19 states. The carrier is the nation's seventh largest in terms of Customers carried and operates one of the youngest pure jet fleets in the domestic airline industry with an average age of seven years.

Southwest Airlines is the first and only major airline to twice capture the industry's "Triple Crown" for its 1992 and 1993 performance, based on statistics published in Department of Transportation (DOT) Air Travel Consumer reports. The "Triple Crown" consists of the best on-time performance, best baggage handling record, and fewest Customer complaints of all major U.S. carriers. Southwest operates more than 1,500 flight a day with an all-jet fleet of 161 Boeing 737s.

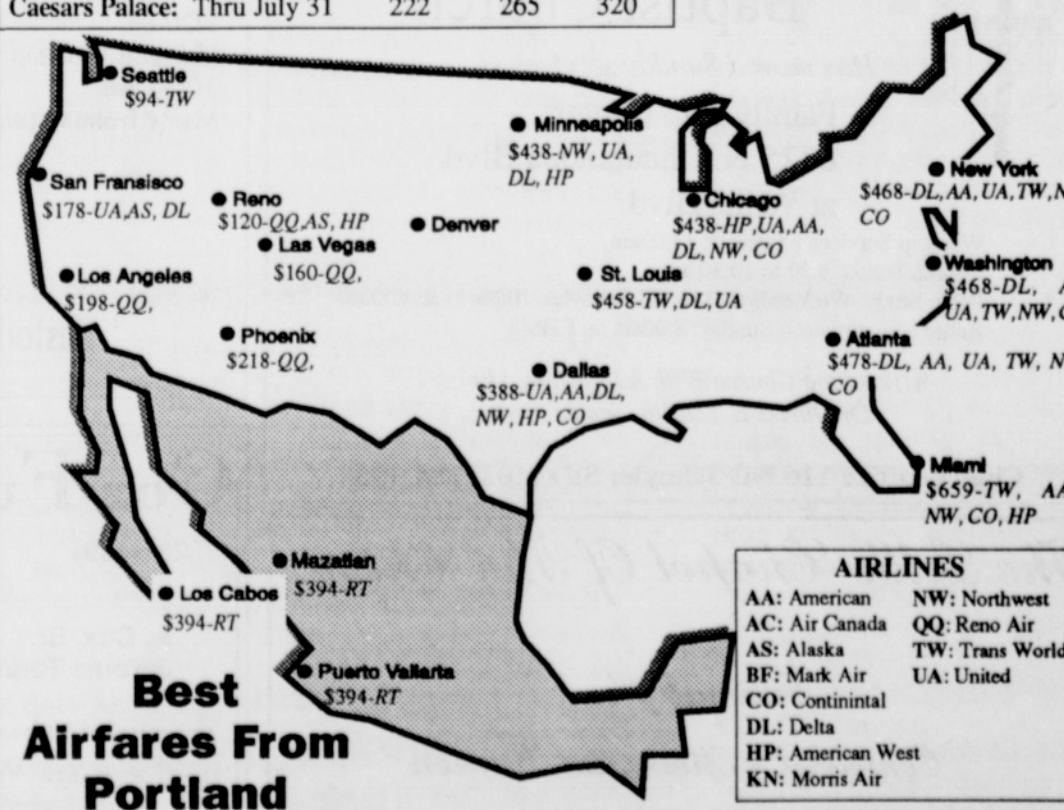
