TRAIL BLAZERS COMPLETE PHASE ONE OF "PDX: GATEWAY TO OREGON"

COMPLETED PHASE ONE OF INSTALLATION OF THE DISPLAY ADVERTISING CONCESSION AT PORTLAND INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT (PDX).

The Blazers developed the advertising theme, "PDX: Gateway to Oregon", to promote and enhance tourism, industry and the region's people and places through contemporary state-of-the-art technologies.

The innovative technologies planned for the airport includes: interactive multimedia, providing a cutting-edge information service for finding hotels for inbound passengers; fiber optics, combining sophisticated technology with dynamic graphics allowing multiple messages from a single display position; ambient sound, matched with appropriate murals giving passersby the sounds of Oregon's coast, forest and mountains; and widescreen video systems, utilizing the new HDTV aspect ratio for extraordinary natural and scenic pictures on large screens in a "cinema" format.

"We wanted to take a breakthrough approach in airport advertising," said Marshall Glickman, Blazers senior vice president. "What better way to do it than by showcasing the diversity and dynamic energy of the region to the nearly 11.5 million people that visit PDX each year. PDX is Oregon's hub for regional, national

We know that people who are coming to the region to do business are coming through PDX and we want them to know what a wonderful, dynamic and emerging environment this area is. The way to portray that is through a complete picture of the region rather than just focusing on scenery."

> Ira Weinstein, president of Airport interviewing and Research in White Plains, NY, and a leading expert in airport marketing and research feels the Blazers have accomplished an important goal. "Airport advertising in general is based upon assumptions and technologies of the 1970's and 1980's. What the Trail Blazers have accomplished at Portland International Airport is take airport advertising and propel it forward to the 21st century," said Weinstein.

The Port of Portland awarded the five-year contract in August, 1993 asking the Blazers to develop and manage the display advertising concession at PDX. The planning for Phase Two (final phase) is now underway with installation scheduled for completion in January, 1995. Phase Two will include work on Concourse D and the two pedestrian tunnels located under the short-term parking garages.


