## **Employment** in Oregon: **April 1994**

Oregon's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate dropped to 5.9 percent in April, from the March rate of 6.3 percent. This drop puts Oregon's unemployment rate slightly below the national figure of 6.4 percent.

The number of Oregonians unemployed is now 97,100. This is the first month since November 1991 when fewer than 100,000 Oregonians have been actively seeking work without finding suitable employment.


April marks the second consecutive month with a large decline in seventeen years ago from his native Oregon's unemployment rate. While this is good news for Oregon's workforce, analysts at the Employment Department caution that the new U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics formulas used to compute most states' rates are resulting in unusually large fluctuations in Oregon's monthly unemployment rates.

In April Oregon's employment counts from the Employment Department's survey of businesses showed a slight decline in overall seasonally adjusted employment levels. A seasonally adjusted decline of 2,500 jobs in total nonagricultural payroll indicates the job growth of the past two years has moderated early this year.

Part of the employment decline in April is attributed to the trucking industry strike ending April 29th. Nine hundred trucking workers were on strike and were not counted in the payroll employment totals.

Hiring new workers in the construction sector in April was not as strong as in previous years, causing construction's seasonally adjusted employment to decline by 500 jobs over the month. Still, construction employment levels, remain at historically high levels in Oregon. Durable goods manufacturing showed a slight gain in April, and is now 900 jobs above its January level, on a seasonally adjusted basis. Notably, fabricated metals manufacturing, which now employs 11,800, has turned the corner after the national recession, adding 300 jobs over the month, and 900 jobs over the year. Wholesale trade employment has basically been flat since January. Seasonally adjusted retail employment grew by 800 in April, to return to its February level.

Cutbacks in federal natural resource agencies continue to impact Oregon. Nine hundred fewer federal government workers are employed than in April 1993. Similarly, state government employment is not expanding the Oregon's population growth, and now employs the same number of workers as it did one year
