

Summer Safety Program

"We are excited to be part of the national agenda," said Fred Williams, President of PAL and partner of Perkins and Co. "With additional corporate support for our base programs and our partnership with Leaders Roundtable, we will make an impact this summer through crime prevention efforts."

Announced by President Clinton at an AmeriCorps Public Safety Forum on March 10 in Brooklyn, New York, Summer of Safety will involve nearly 7,000 participants who will serve with 91 projects in 70 urban and rural locations around the United States.

"Summer of Safety participants will help American people take their communities back," said Eli Segal, assistant to Clinton and CEO of the Corporation for National Service. "They will come together across generations, ethnically and income levels to do the work that communities deem most necessary in their critical fight against crime and violence."

In June 1994, PAL will increase its crime prevention efforts by opening its first PAL Youth Center in the Rockwood neighborhood. A ribbon cutting ceremony and introduction of the VISTA Summer Associates is scheduled for June 14, 11:30 a.m. at 424 N.E. 172nd. The 35 VISTA Summer Associates will be based at the PAL Youth Center coordinating recreation-based programs, a National Night Out, graffiti paint-over projects, neighborhood canvassing with safety information and counseling in various summer sports camps.

"The VISTA grant gives PAL an opportunity to introduce college-aged students to a whole new experience," said Portland State student Jerry Cioeta. "It introduces us to community children, and gives us hands-on experience about what today's children are facing in society."

Applications are available through PAL (248-5011), the Leaders Roundtable (228-8617), and the Corporation for National Service office (231-2103). Applications are being accepted through May 30th.

U.S. Sen. Mark Hatfield, R-Ore., will chair a "Listening To America" meeting in Portland to solicit viewpoints and ideas from Oregonians whose livelihoods depend on even-handed environmental policies that foster economic growth. The meeting will focus on the impact of environmental policies on salmon recovery and the timber industry.

"For too long, the American people have been shut out of policy decisions that affect their families and business on a day-to-day basis," said Haley Barbour, chairman of the

Republican-oriented "Listening to America" project. The project is sponsored by the National Policy Forum: A Republican Center for the Exchange of Ideas.

The meeting will be held June 2, from 9 a.m. to noon at the Portland Marriott, 1401 SW Front Ave., Salon D. The meeting will focus on audience participation and is open to the public, free of charge. All concerned citizens are invited to attend.

"Environmental policies and their impact on jobs and economic growth are at the forefront of the national

policy debate," Barbour said. "It's a critical debate that absolutely must take place, but, too often, the discussion is confined to Washington with very little input from the people who are affected by these policies day-in and day-out."

According to Barbour, "Listening to America" is designed to broaden the debate over issues like environmental policies by giving Americans at the grassroots level, regardless of party affiliation, a voice in developing national policies.
