An inmate work crew will work all day Monday, June 20, to paint, clean and refurbishsome play equipment in Dawson Park, she said. In exchange for this labor, the Portland Park Bureau has said it will waive its park rental fees for the gospel music festivals slated for the park July 16 and Aug. 3.

"This takes a real financial burden off us," said Boles. "It is very reasonable for the city to charge rent for the parks, but staging these festivals requires so much money that this

The festivals cost about \$3,500 each to stage, without the rental fee, she said. "That's a lot of money when you are rasing it in two and three-digit amounts.' Boles added that she is well

pleased with the work done by the inmates, who come to the job under the leadership of an officer, and who come equipped with all their own tools, including a portable toilet. Boles said she plans to use in-

mate work crews whenever possible in the future, including other parks for other festivals in other years. The crews are available for situations where there is no competition with the private sector, she said.
