"Secrets of the Great Pyramid," Peter Tompkins, Harper and Row, 1971; The best and most thorough of the 'Pyramid' books. Factual documentation of the African Science and mathematics incorporated into the design and structure of the Great Pyramid at Gizeh, Africa. Includes the eye-opening evaluation by Sir Isaac Newton.

"Isaac Newton, Historian," by Frank E. Manuel, the Belknap Press, Harvard University Press, 1963. This priceless book with its many pages of notes, references and bibliography will open new windows upon the vast vistas of this scientist's studies and research into African science and mathematics (Note reference to Newton and the Great Pyramid in Tompkins book above). Newton also traced the African colonies and cul-

"Ancient Egyptian Literature, Three Vols." by Miriam Lichtheim, University of California Press at Berkeley 1976. You will be astounded to learn the true source for the themes and plots of the world's great literature, allegedly conceived by Europeans; Biblical passages and stories, famous odes and heroic passages, the stuff of our fairy tales, epic poetry, all will ring familiar bells as you 'read the original.'

It is no wonder that as I do these national radio talk shows on the communications Superhighway originating in my office, I am getting tremendous feedback from people of all walks and institutions: Students, teachers, college faculty, curriculum specialists, book publishers, parents, historians (My fax has run out of paper in as little as 24 hours and I have had to get help to sort it all out.)
