## HARLEM GLOBETROTTERS SET TO TOUR SOUTH AFRICA

The Harlem Globetrotters will set yet another 1994 milestone becoming the first professional basketball team from the United States to tour South Africa with games scheduled for mid-October 1994, it was announced today by Harlem Globetrotters International, Inc., Chairman and majority owner Mannie Jackson.

In a landmark international negotiation with the free democratic South Africa a letter of intent between Harlem Globetrotters International,

Inc., and Cedric Kushner Promotions, Ltd., has been signed that includes games to be played between October 13 and October 22, 1994. In a gesture of support for the human rights movement in South Africa, 100% of net proceeds from special exhibition games and clinics townships, will be donated to the African National Congress Sports Fund.

"As the renowned Ambassadors of Goodwill, it is fitting that the Harlem Globetrotters make this landmark first step in celebration of South

Africa's new era," says Cedric Kushner.

Social consciousness, an expansion of its international impact, has been paramount to the new direction of the Harlem Globetrotters under the leadership of owner Mannie Jackson. This tour reflects that commitment and continues the Harlem Globetrotters organization's 68-year tradition of reaching out to communities around the globe as South Africa becomes the 113th country visited by the legendary "Magicians of Basketball."

## WILLIAMS MEETS ZOLKIN IN HEAVYWEIGHT BOUT

Carl "The Truth" Williams, who challenged Larry Holmes and Mike Tyson for their heavyweight world title belts, meets rising prospect Alexander Zolkin in a 10-round headliner at the Souter Belle in Tunica, Miss., Friday, July 22.

Aired live on ESPN's Top Rank boxing, Williams (26-7, 20 KOs) makes his first appearance in the ring this year, while Zolkin (17-2, 12 KOs) originally from Moscow, Russia

brings with him a No. 11 ranking by the World Boxing Council.

Williams, 34, from White Plains, NY has not shied away from meeting the best the division can offer. A pro since 1982, Williams has met fellow contenders James "Quick" Tilis, Jesse Ferguson and Bert Cooper, along with former world champions Mike Weaver, Trevor Berbick, Tim Witherspoon and Tommy "The Duke" Morrison.

In a 15-round war, Williams lost to

then-IBF champ Larry Homes in 1985. His next world title challenge did not come until four years later when Tyson kayoed him in the first round. In his last outing, April 24, 1993, Williams was stopped in the 10th round by two-time world-champ contender Frank Bruno.

Wilson knocked out Cooper on June 21, 1987 to capture the USBA crown and successfully defended it four times before succumbing to Witherspoon in 1991 by decision.

## CARBAJAL TAKES ON WBO CHAMP CAMACHO

Former International Boxing Federation and World Boxing Council light flyweight champion Michael Carbajal (31-1, 19 KOs) will challenge World Boxing Organization titlist Josue Camacho (15-2, 6 KOs), July 15 at the America West Arena.

Gonzalez wrestled the IBF and WBC crowns from Carbajal on a split-decision, Feb. 19 in Los Angeles, but has been in no hurry to offer the Olympic silver medalist a second rematch. Carbajal overcame two early knockdowns to score a sudden and dramatic

seventh-round knockout of then-WBC champ Gonzalez in their first meeting in April 1993.

While Carbajal waits on a fretting Gonzalez, he'll concentrate on dethroning Puerto Rico's Camacho. "Carbajal deserves a chance to regain his IBF and WBC titles."

The Hillsboro Football Club, Portland's under 18 boys soccer team demonstrated their hunger to win as they advanced to the National Championship, the premier youth soccer tournament in the United States.

Hillsboro defeated Santos from Glendale, Arizona in a 2-0 victory at the National Championship in Bakersfield, California on July 2. The team takes home the title of Western Region IV Champions in the boys under 18 age group. The Hillsboro Football Club now travels to Blaine, Minnesota to compete with other regional winning teams from across the country at the 1994 Cup, which will be

played July 27-31.
