JoAnn Allen, assistant to Multnomah County Commissioner Beverly Stein and Stand Up Portland co-chair, added, "It is appropriate to join forces with The Bite because the vent is a primary fundraiser for the Special Olympics. The message to

honor and to celebrate all people is very basic to what the Special Olympics is all about."


First Step Taken To Fund Regional Transportation
