National Program On Billy Graham Focuses On Portland, Oregon Crusade

Crusade: The Life Of Billy Graham, a one-hour biography on the life and faith of the man who has preached to more people than any other person in history--approaching 110 million--will be broadcast on Sunday, August 14 at 8 pm on OPB TV. The program, a co-production of WTTW/Chicago and Cutting Edge Productions, focuses on Graham's 1992 Portland, Oregon crusade.

Randall Balmer, professor of religion at Barnard College, Columbia University, author of several books on the history of religion in America, and writer and host of the popular public televi-

sion series Mine Eyes Have Seen The Glory, hosts this provocative look at one of the most famous and influential preachers of the twentieth century.

William Franklin Graham, better known as Billy Graham, is considered by many as the face and voice of evangelicals in America today. His career spans more than five decades and at 75 years of age, millions still hang on his words.

Confidant to popes and presidents, monarchs and dictators, the Billy Graham saga is an American success story. With natural talent and an uncanny knack for self-promotion, Graham has become, over the de-

cadés, a cultural icon. Millions of people the world over associate him with honesty, integrity, Christianity and middle-class values.

In addition to probing the personal side of Billy Graham, Crusade: The Life Of Billy Graham goes behind the scenes of one of his crusades. Evangelicals believe that conversion, the act of accepting Jesus as your personal Lord and Savior, is a process every man, woman and child needs to go through in order to be saved. Graham's crusades are centered around bringing about those conversions. Each night, at the conclusion of his sermon,

Graham invites members of the audience to come forward to the base of the stage as a public declaration of their new or renewed commitment to Jesus.

To this end each crusade, like the one in Portland, Oregon, is the culmination of years of careful planning. The scale of each event is immense, from ushers and technicians to choir members and counselors. In all, the Graham organization estimates that 30,000 people played some part in preparing for the Portland crusade. Oregon Public Broadcasting is a public television and radio network serving Oregon and southern Washington.

Traffic Safety Fair Scheduled

A traffic safety fair for children will be held Thursday from 10 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. at E & M Community Market, 909 N. Killingsworth St. Bicycle safety, pedestrian safety, bicycle repair and free bicycle helmets will be distributed to low income children who live at the nearby Piedmont Plaza apartments.

More than 150 kids and Piedmont Plaza supporters are expected to attend. The event is being coordinated by the Portland Office of Transportation's Traffic Management Bureau under the director of City Commissioner Earl Blumenaer.

The event also serves as reinforcement of the new state bicycle helmet law that went into effect on July 1.
