Loans For Multi-Family Properties Offered

Buyers looking to secure financing for smaller multi-family properties and consisting of five or more units are often given few options. Loans in this category were considered too small for commercial lenders and too large for residential lenders. But with the introduction of General Motors Acceptance Corp. (GMAC) Mortgage's Five Plus program, financing these multi-family properties is now possible.

The features of the program are similar to those of single family loans, namely longer terms of 25 years, lower costs when compared with other commercial loans and closing within 45 days of loan application. Previously, commercial lending carried balloon terms which caused buyers to payoff the loan or refinance every five years or so. They also required the high costs and a processing time of four to five months.

"The five plus program is an excellent way to expand our mortgage finance services, said Mark Korell, president and chief executive office of the GMAC Mortgage Group. "It's introduction is consistent with our mission of leadership in housing America.

The loans are offered nationwide through GMAC's residential and commercial branches.

St. Johns Apartments Refurbished

City officials, neighborhood leaders, developers, financiers and Portland Police gathered Thursday to mark renovation of the Cathedral Park Apartments, a two-building, 40unit apartment complex in the St. Johns neighborhood.

The \$928,000 rehabilitation project was born of a private-public partnership of the Cathedral Park Partnership, Liberty Federal Bank and the Portland Development Commission. The PDC joined the bank to provide financing for the private, for-profit venture as part of the agency's mission to increase the supply of affordable housing in Portland.

Before the renovation, the apartments were in severe disrepair. Formerly named the Ivanhoe Apartments and the Syracuse Apartments, neighborhood leaders considered the two

buildings an eyesore and Portland Police were frequently called to the apartments

"I am please to see community leaders working with our financial community to make it possible to turn these buildings into quality housing for families and to help make this neighborhood a more pleasant and safe place to raise children," said Portland City Commissioner Gretchen Kafoury

The two-story buildings hold 20 apartments each. Located at the corner of North Syracuse and North Ivanhoe streets, they have 38 twobedroom apartments and two onebedroom units.

Rents range from \$375 to \$540 per month.

The Tri-Met Employees will arrive between 1:30pm and paint until roughly 4:30pm.


