At The Fair With Drug Free Marshals

The Drug Free Marshals of the Portland area increased their ranks by over 150 kids during their participation in the 10th annual Hawthorne Street Fair last weekend.

The campaign is part of the national anti-drug program, Lead the Way to a Drug Free USA, sponsored by the Church of Scientology, and is centered on getting children and teens to take an oath to remain drug-free and to help friends and family stay drug-free as well. The program, active in cities throughout the U.S., has already sworn in over 1,500 children as Drug Free Marshals.

At the Hawthorne Street Fair, local marshals asked passers-by if they would like to take the Marshal promise. After officially swearing to uphold each of the seven points of the Drug Free Marshal pledge, participants signed their name and were bagged with their official Drug Free Marshal star.

The marshals were a big suc-

cess amongst adults and children alike. Kids and adults ranging from 2 to 75 years-old wanted to support the campaign by taking the pledge and sporting their badges throughout the rest of the fair.

Angie Mann, spokesperson for the marshals, stated, "It really means something to these kids to become Drug Free Marshals. They wear their badges with pride and no longer feel inhibited about saying no to drugs. You know you have a successful campaign when 6 and 16 year-olds will say, 'No way: I'm a Drug Free Marshall!'"

Portland area Marshals hold frequent events around town, swearing in community leaders and law enforcement agencies or talking with other groups of kids about what they've learned about drugs.
