# Oregon Students Are More Diverse

The University of Oregon student body this year will be larger and more diverse than last year, according to preliminary fall enrollment figures released by admissions director Jim Buch.

"Total enrollment is projected to reach between 16,800 and 16,900 students, compared to 16,593 last year, said Buch.

The new mix of students will also be more racially diverse than those in recent years.

"Students of color have increased from 11.7 percent of the student body last year to just over 12 percent this year," Buch said. The trend reflects the university's efforts to recruit more students of color to the campus.

The fall counts indicate a change in the composition of the freshman class as well.

"The number of freshmen from Oregon has gone up," said Buch. "Our freshman class looks as if it will have more than 100 more residents students than last year, 1,957 versus 1,849."

At the same time, the number of out-of-state freshmen has dropped by an equal amount, resulting in a freshmen class in which nearly 55 percent of the students are from Oregon. This is a shift from recent trends toward more out-of-state freshmen, Buch said, which highlights a commitment to accepting all qualified Oregon students.


