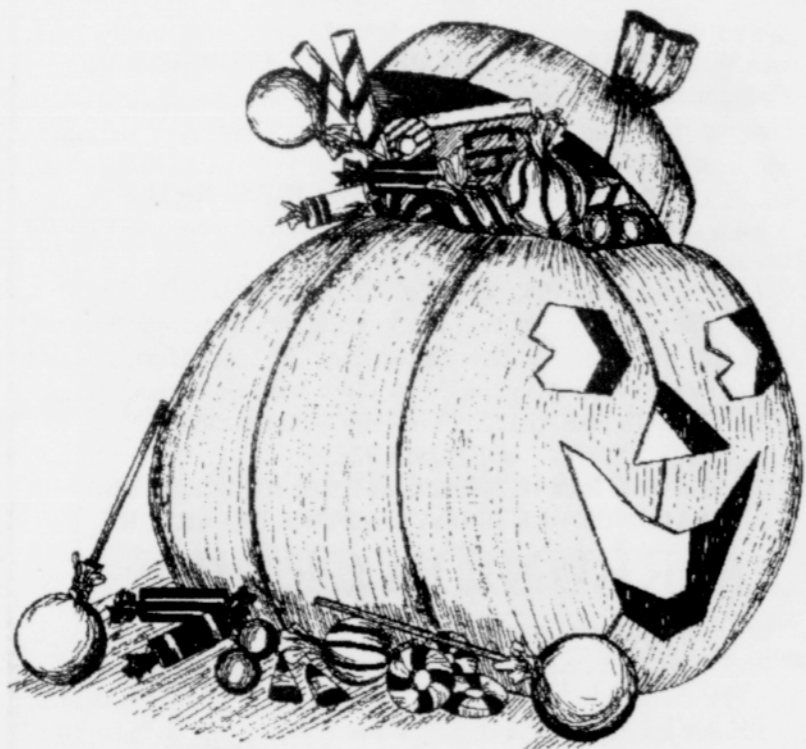




PUMPKIN PIE SOCIAL AT FOREST GROVE RESIDENTIAL CENTER

LLOYD CENTER TO HOST SAFE TRICK OR TREAT EVENT

This year's "Safe and Sane Halloween" gives children and parents the opportunity to enjoy Halloween in a secure, comfortable environment.

As part of its participation in National Crime Prevention Month, the Lloyd Center will host its annual trick or treat event, "Safe and Sane Halloween", on Sunday, October 30 from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. The event, co-sponsored by KPDX Fox 49, offers safety tips, treats for kids, and peace of mind for adults.

The afternoon will feature t.v.'s crime dog "McGruff," who will be on hand to provide parents and children tips on keeping Halloween safe. "This event, aside from giving the kids a fun and safe place to enjoy Halloween, is also an occasion to edu-

cate them and their parents about safe trick or treat practices," said Rosemary B. White, marketing director of Lloyd Center. "Both kids and parents can come away from the afternoon with something."

Aside from "goody" bags and safety information, there will be a trick or treat candy giveaway in the Center court, sponsored by Lloyd Center merchants.

The Lloyd Center has sponsored "Safe and Sane Halloween" for three years as part of its effort to promote safety throughout the community.

Lloyd Center opened in 1960 as the largest shopping center in the country. It underwent a \$200 million renovation in 1991 and is now the largest shopping center in Oregon with 175 stores.

PETTE PUMPKIN PATCH

Dessert Ingredients:

- 4 tiny pumpkins, about 3-inches in diameter
- 1 quart Dreyer's Grand Pumpkin ice cream
- Ground cinnamon
- Warm Caramel Sauce or Bourbon Sauce (recipes below)

Dessert Method:

- Pierce the bottoms of pumpkins with a knife in 3 or 4 places. Microwave on High (100% power) 6-to-7 minutes, just until pumpkins are tender when pierced or gently squeezed. Cool.
- Slice off tops and scoop out seeds and pumpkin meat, leaving shells intact. Reserve tops.
- Use dessert plates and arrange pumpkin shells in middle of plate. Place a large scoop of Dreyer's Grand Pumpkin ice cream in the center of each pumpkin.
- Pour warm caramel or bourbon sauce over ice cream and around pumpkin on dessert plate. Dust with cinnamon and arrange pumpkin tops to the side of shells.
- Serve immediately.

Warm Caramel Sauce Ingredients:

(Can substitute prepared caramel sauce)

- 1/4 cup butter or margarine
- 1 cup packed light brown sugar
- 1/2 cup heavy cream

Caramel Sauce Method:

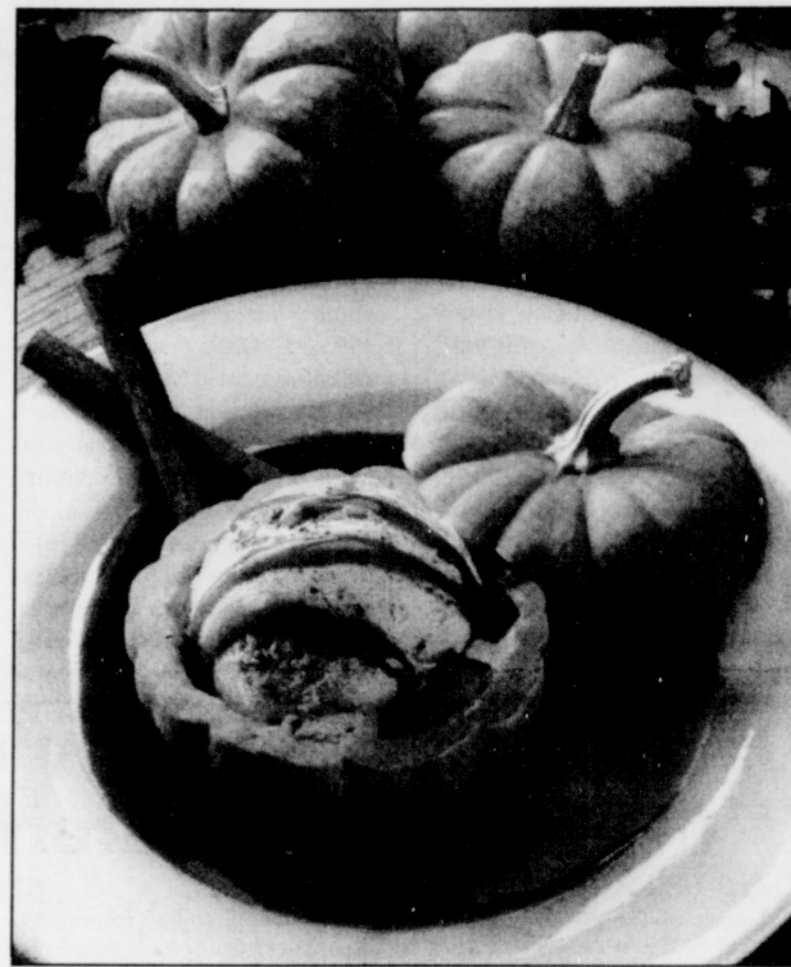
- In a 4-cup glass measure or deep microwavable bowl, microwave butter on High (10% power) 45 to 60 seconds to melt.
- Add brown sugar and cream and whisk until blended.
- Microwave 2-to-2 1/2 minutes more until bubbly and slightly thickened. Stir once during cooking.
- Serve warm. Makes about 1-1/3 cups.

Bourbon Sauce Ingredients:

- 1/2 cup butter or margarine
- 2/3 cup sugar
- 1 egg 1/4 cup bourbon

Bourbon Sauce Method:

- In a 4-cup glass measure or deep microwavable bowl, microwave butter on High (100% power) until sugar dissolves and sauce thickens, about 2 to 3 minutes, stirring once during cooking.
- Cool slightly, then stir in bourbon.
- Serve warm. Makes about 1-1/4 cups.



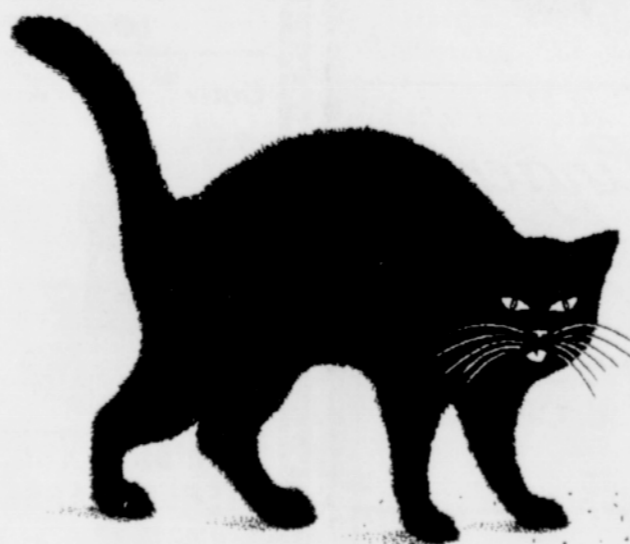

NEIGHBORHOOD RECLAIMS STREETS FOR CHILDREN ON HALLOWEEN

On Halloween night, residents of North Portland's Boise Neighborhood will take back their streets for the children of the community.

The Central Albina Safety Committee, in association with Housing Our Families and Custom Marble, is organizing a Halloween Party and Safety Walk. At 5:15 p.m. adults and children will gather to celebrate the holiday at a free party held at 4000 N. Shaver. Festivities will include a costume contest, face-painting, games with prizes, and treats.

At 7:30 p.m. area residents will join together to symbolically reclaim their neighborhood from gangs, drug dealers, and violence. They will walk as a group through the streets to show

their pride in and commitment to the neighborhood. Children will trick-or-treat along the way and everyone will be encouraged to wear costumes.

The Central Albina Safety Committee is a group of community residents working together to increase the safety and stability of the Boise area. They are sponsored by Housing Our Families, a non-profit community development corporation.

The Halloween Party and Safety Walk will be held Monday, October 31. The Party is located at 4000 N. Shaver (corner of N. Mississippi and N. Shaver) from 5:15 p.m. to 7:15 p.m. The Safety Walks is from 7:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m.
