Notice of Cancellation of Public Hearing

Notice is hereby given that the public hearing previously scheduled to be held by the Tri-County Metropolitan Transportation District of Oregon (Tri-Met) at 3:30 p.m., Wednesday, November 30, 1994, at the Portland Building, 1120 SW 5th Avenue, 2nd floor, room "C", will not be held because no requests for a hearing were received.

The hearing would have been held for the purpose of considering a grant application requesting capital assistance from the Federal Transit Administration.

The project under consideration is the Banfield Light Rail Communications Retrofit project. This project will make improvements in the communication and control components of the existing MAX system to make them compatible with the new Westside line. Partial funding for this project was approved by FTA on April 7, 1994. Tri-Met proposes in this grant application to seek FY95 fixed guideway modernization formula funds of \$894,947 federal (\$1,118,684 total) for continuation of the project. Future years' fixed guideway modernization funds will be used to finance completion of the project.

While formal public testimony will not be taken on the application at this November 30, 1994, meeting of Tri-Met's Board of Directors, the meeting is open to all. The application remains available for inspection at the Tri-Met Grants Department, 4th floor, 4012 SE 17th Avenue, Portland, Oregon.

The construction of asphalt pavement, sidewalks, curbs, drainage improvements, sanitary sewer, water quality facility, street lights, traffic signals, associated drainage pond work, and associated work as shown on the plans for Project No. TB 817, **Street, Storm Drainage, Sanitary Sewer, Street Lighting, and Traffic Signal Improvements for N. E. 86th Avenue from N.E. Fourth Plain Blvd. to N. E. 20th Street.**

The work shall consist of furnishing all labor, equipment and materials necessary to construct approximately 7,417 L.F. of cement concrete curbs, 3,500 S.Y. asphalt concrete, cement concrete sidewalks, driveways. The federal operating assistance would supplement Tri-Met general operating resources for the period 7/1/94 to 6/30/95. Most of the 20 minibuses purchased with grant funds would support expanded transportation for the elderly and disabled. Design of a pedestrian and bicycle bridge connected to the future Sunset Transit Center of the Westside Light Rail Project would be initiated with the funds noted above.

No persons, families or businesses will be displaced by the projects. Projects described above are in conformance with comprehensive land use and transportation planning in the area and are programmed in regional and state Transportation Improvement Programs.

In the event a hearing is held, Tri-Met will afford opportunity for interested persons or agencies to be heard with respect to the social, economic, and environmental aspects of the projects.
