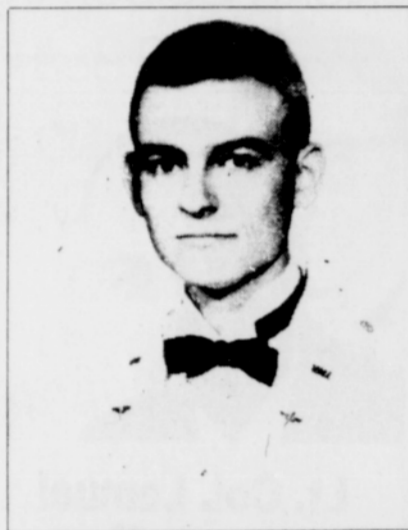
Killed By Nightriders, Anniston, Ala.
