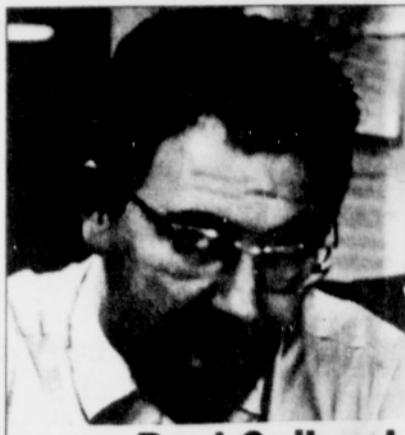

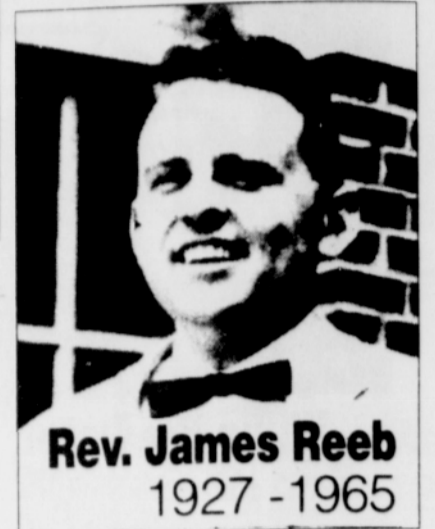

# IN HONOR OF THE MAN AND HIS DREAM

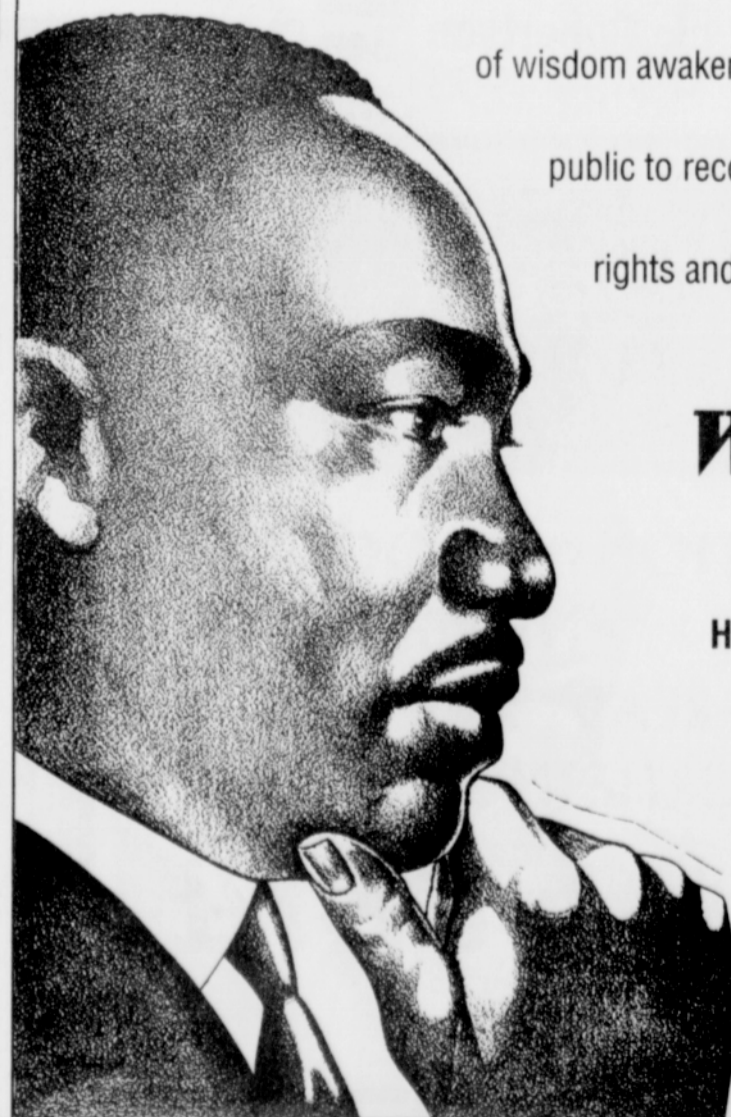
On August 28, 1963 Martin Luther King's voice echoed over the crowds at the Lincoln Memorial — one hundred years and eight months after
