Grocery Workers Fail To Qualify For Jobiess Benefits

Grocery workers locked out of the workplace by employers during a 1994 strike against Fred Meyer stores do not qualify for jobless benefits, according to a ruling yesterday by the state

Employment Department. The decision affects 1,380 people represented by Local 555 of United Food and Commercial Workers who were employed by the Safeway, Albertson, and Kienow chains, as well as other stores. These workers applied for unemployment insurance last year after employers declared a lock out an refused them work during a 12-week strike against Fred Meyer that ended November 12, 1994.

Under state law enacted by the Legislature (ORS 657.200), a worker involved in a labor dispute is disqualified for unemployment benefits. According to yesterday's ruling, "This situation [was] clearly a labor dispute. Since these individuals were unemployed due to a labor dispute, they were not qualified for benefits." An administrative Law Judge at

the Employment Department issued the decision after holding hearings on October 25, and November 1,

The Employment Department sent copies of the ruling yesterday to the 1,380 applicants. They have the right to appeal, but must file an application with the state Employment Appeals Board by January 30.
