Ecumenical Ministries Awarded HIV/AIDS Service Grants

Ecumenical Ministries of Oregon has been awarded three Ryan White Grants to fulfill unmet needs for services to persons and their families living with HIV/AIDS.

Services include health insurance continuation assistance, nutritious meals and dietary assessments, say and respite care. The Grants total \$467,000.

Clients eligible for these services must have HIV or AIDS, meet income criteria, and reside in Multnomah, Yamhill, Clackamas, Washington or Columbia Counties in Oregon or Clark County in Washing-

Services will be provided at the Ecumenical Ministries' HIV Day Center in Southwest Portland.

In announcing the awards, Ecumenical Ministries of Oregon's Executive Director, The Rev. Rodney Page, stated, "These grants are welcome relief for persons and their families facing the most devastating medical crisis of modern time."

According to Rev. Page, "Ryan White Grants are enacted by Congress to improve the availability, organization and quality of health care and support services for persons who

endure incredible circumstances of suffering and isolation due to the nature of their disease."

Since 1981, 2,268 Oregonians have had AIDS and an estimated 20,000 others are infected with HIV.

By the year 2000, the World health Organization projects that the cumulative worldwide total HIV infections among men, women and children will range between 30 and 40 million.
