

Epic Records' rap/bass duo Dis 'N' Dat continue to heat up Summer '95 with a nomination for Best Rap album in the first annual Soul Train Lady Of Soul Awards. Featuring single "Freak Me Baby", which has been on the Hot 100's chart for 10

weeks, 7 weeks top # 10 rap and for 14 weeks on the r&b chart, Bumpin' is nominated in the same category with Funkdified by Da Brat and TLC's CraxySexyCool. The live, twohour ceremony was telecast from Santa Monica Civic Center August 6.

Dis 'N' Dat, Atlanta-based Bennett sisters Tenesia (Nee Nee) and Tishea (Shea-Shea), first hit the bass music scene as featured dancers on a major tour headlined by 95 South. Once 95 South's Jay McGowan discovered the two could also rap, he took them into the studio to record their 1992 debut single "Whoot! Here It Is," a high-spirited, comic response to 95 south'; platinum hit -- which still reigns as one of America's favorite phrases.

The ladies have been on the road with the Bass Fest Tour featuring 95 South and 69 Boyz throughout the summer, putting bass in places like Chicago, Cincinnati and Orlando, the latter in which they taped a special guest appearance for Stomp!, a national step competition to air in syndication this fall.

Of the nomination for the first annual Soul Train Lady Of Soul Awards the ladies say, "We're proud to be included in what will go down in history as the first ceremony. We're also glad to represent for the fans of bass music across the country."
