Nation's Largest African American Organization Plans March On Birmingham

The National Baptist Convention, USA, Inc., the nation's largest African American organization, announced that plans are being made for a Mass march in Birmingham. The March is scheduled for September 6, 1995 during NBC's 115th Annual National Convention. In a letter to the Congressional Black Caucus and all civil rights organizations, the Convention's new President, Dr. Henry J. Lyons said, "The March is being held to show America that Black Americans will not sit back and allow the recent acts of congress and the U.S. Supreme Court to go unchecked!"

According to Dr. Lyons, African Americans, have always had to have the law on their side in order to achieve any measure of success in this country. He says, the leadership in Congress and the U.S. Supreme Court, is trying to turn the clock back, to repeal those laws that endure Africans Americans equal opportunity.

Says the new national NBC President, "It is timely that we are convening in Birmingham, Alabama, the city which symbolizes the cradle of the civil rights struggle.

It is the city where Dr. King wrote his passionate "Letter from a

Birmingham Jail;" the city where three of our own Baptist children were killed in the bombing of the 16th Street Baptist Church and the city where we intend to bring back to the attention of all Americans the struggle we must continue and the dream we must keep alive." Lyons also said, "In 1963, Dr. King had a dream, but, in 1995, we are experiencing a nightmare!

The National Baptist Convention represents over 8,000,000 people and more than 30,000 churches. Over 60,000 are expected in Birmingham for the National Convention and over 25,000 plan to march.

Lyons has asked the National Urban League, the NAACP, the Congressional Black Caucus, the SCLC and numerous other African American organizations to join with the National Baptists in this historic Birmingham March.

President Clinton has also been invited to attend. The March will take place on Wednesday, September 6, 1995, at 3:00 PM.

It will begin at the Birmingham Civic Center. Marchers will file through the city toward the 16th Street Baptist Church, and end at the Birmingham Civil Rights Park with a speech by president Lyons.

Former New Jersey Governor Thomas H. Kean, Drew's tenth president, presided over the ceremonies held on the south lawn of historic Mead Hall.

To stand up and let that voice be heard. To stand up and bring people together," said Shue," ... life is too short, too precious, to be lost at the hands of doubters."

Drew University is a selective, independent university with an enrollment of 2,100 in a College of Liberal Arts, a Graduate School and a Theological School which maintains its historic affiliation with the United Methodist Church.
